Minutes: BILL SUMMARY: Relating to peace officer standards, training, and licensing.

<u>Vice Chair Maragos</u>: called the hearing to order.

Sen. Dave Nething, Dist. 48, Jamestown: 13.6 testified in support. This bill deals with peace officers training standards. I am interested because as a law school graduate, I worked at the Attorney Generals Office. In the 1963 session, a bill was passed that made the AG's Office responsible for setting up a peace officer training program. I was made the director of this new program and have been interested in it ever since. This program brings together all of the law enforcement entities in N.D. to have the same standards plus maintain local law enforcement and have a cohesive state law enforcement program. also. Standards are an important area and we want to do a good job for the citizens of N.D.

Mark Gilbertson, N.D. Bureau of Criminal Investigation, Director of Training and Exec. Sec. for POST (Peace Officers Standards/Training Board: testified in support of the bill. This bill is some amendments to Chapter 12-63 of the N.D. Century Code. The first change is in the

definition section. In 1989, when the licensing legislation was originally passed, the reference to the criminal justice training and statistics division was put in, which made the Attorney General responsible for licensing and standards. Since that time there has been a reorganization within the **B**ureau of Criminal Investigation. The second amendment deals with if adverse action has been taken against a license of any peace officer for cause. Something that officer has done to no longer be worthy of practicing as a peace officer. The one year waiting period was added to bring the entire section into sameness. The final amendment is in the penalty section to bring it to likeness with the rest of the criminal penalties in the N.D. Century Code.

<u>Vice Chair Maragos</u>: In the case of the denial, what recourse does the applicant have for appeal, if he thinks it is unfair?

Mark: 19.0 According to 12-63.12, which covers the entire adverse license action, the board can't take final action against a person until the entire administrative process has been followed. The denied person can go before district court to appeal.

Rep. Koppelman: In the penalty section, what constitutes violation of a chapter. Is it a person seeking a reinstatement without waiting a year or is it the boards failure to follow this procedure? What is this penalty applied to?

Mark: 20.1 The adverse license action section clearly specifies those instances where a person could be held to any type of license action. The class B misdemeanor deals with any person who practices peace officer duties without meeting all the requirements to be a peace officer.

Rep. Koppelman: 20.9 Do you think class B is tough enough?

Mark: I think it is fitting, because of all the other ramifications by violation of law. A subdivision who would hire someone not qualified as a peace officer would have unbelievable liability potential.

Rep. N. Johnson: 22.0 Can someone come back within two days, if they are denied, and try again?

Mark: That's correct. We have had that. An application was denied and they came back the next day.

<u>Rep. Rose</u>: 22.8 "Refusal to renew" under section 2, is that disciplinary action that your group takes?

<u>Mark</u>: It is one of the actions available to the regulatory board for persons who do not meet their continuing education requirements or side arms qualifications. It's a lesser degree then revoking or suspending the license.

<u>Vice Chair Maragos</u>: Have you ever prosecuted this violation?

<u>Mark</u>: There has never been a prosecution to date for the class B misdemeanor. The board has taken administration action against the licenses of individuals.

<u>Dick Peck, N.D. Peace Officers Assoc.</u>: 24.0 Want to go on record as supporting this bill.

Rep. Delmore: Do you see any problems with the class B misdemeanor? Is that enough?

<u>Dick Peck</u>: It's adequate.

Rep. Koppelman: Please refresh my memory. What are the penalties for class B misdemeanor? Dick Peck: 30 days and \$1,000.

<u>Vice Chair Maragos</u>: Is there any more testimony in support; any in opposition. Hearing none, the hearing was closed.
