Minutes:

SENATOR B. STENEHJEM opened the hearing on SB 2343. Committee members present included: Sens. Bob Stenehjem, R. Schobinger, D. Mutch, D. Cook, D. O'Connell, V. Thompson, and D. Bercier.

SENATOR W. STENEHJEM I want to testify in support of SB 2343. For the last year, I've served on a subcommittee called the Substance Abuse and Traffic Safety Council. There has been reported increases with citizens who don't pull over for an ambulance as required by law. They asked to come up with a legislative approach; we came up with SB 2343. This bill will raise the fee for failure to pull over from the current fee of \$20.00 to \$50.00. Also, it would adopt the section of law from the statute regarding failure to stop for a school bus. The reason for this is very often vehicles are on their way to an emergency and they are not able to stop and arrest the person who does not pull over. They request that they have the authority to take down

the license plate number of the vehicle and charge the owner of that vehicle a violation unless that person is able to show that someone else was driving a vehicle. This is a problem. People are driving and may not be paying attention to these emergency vehicles.

SENATOR O'CONNELL I used to drive ambulance and the only way we could have any help from law enforcement is if we could identify the driver himself. So now this would charge the driver whether one could identify them or not.

SENATOR W. STENEHJEM That's right, and it will give the owner of the vehicle some responsibility in lending their car. That is what we do with the school bus violation.

SENATOR SCHOBINGER Who gets the \$50.00 if someone else was driving the car?

SENATOR W. STENEHJEM The person driving gets the fine.

SENATOR COOK What if it's the driver's word against the owners?

SENATOR W. STENEHJEM Then the driver needs proof.

SENATOR B. STENEHJEM The problem I have is the \$50.00. I understand the intent but the fee is a little steep. School buses don't come up behind you at a high speed. Isn't it possible that the driver just didn't realize it?

SENATOR W. STENEHJEM I have no objection to changing the fee. It should be more than \$20.00 however.

SENATOR COOK If I'm going over Memorial bridge and an ambulance comes up behind me, am I supposed to stop?

SENATOR W. STENEHJEM You should get across the bridge and then pull over. It's a pretty narrow bridge. The drivers of ambulances and other emergency vehicles understand special circumstances.

Minutes:

CHAIRMAN KEISER OPENED THE HEARING ON SB 2343; A BILL RELATING TO THE PRESUMPTION OF OWNER VIOLATION FOR FAILING TO YIELD RIGHT OF WAY TO AN EMERGENCY VEHICLE; AND RELATING TO THE FEES FOR NONCRIMINAL TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS.

SENATOR WAYNE STENEHJEM, Dist. 42, introduced SB 2343. He noted that the bill is the result of a problem in Grand Forks where people are not pulling over for emergency vehicles. This bill proposes a change in the fine from \$20 to \$50.

REP. KEMPENICH asked who makes the determination if someone needs to pull over.

SEN. STENEHJEM said that drivers need to use their discretion on when and where to pull over. Common sense is primary.

REP. JENSEN asked if this is an erosion of individual rights.

SEN. STENEHJEM said no. Pulling over to let the emergency vehicles pass is customary. If it

is a problem, people have a right to their day in court.

JERRY VEHEN, Grand Forks Fire Marshall, testified in support of SB 2343. He noted that

there has always been a problem with people not pulling over. The law itself is not put to use

that often, but when it is some people still do not pull over.

REP. MICKELSON asked what emergency vehicle is defined as in the Code.

JERRY said Class A emergency vehicles only are regarded here. Those that have the red and

blue rotating lights.

REP. KEMPENICH made note of driving trucks and that emergency vehicles often sneak into

the blind spot. He thought that maybe education needs to be the primary thing here.

REP. THORPE said he has seen this in Grand Forks and noted that it is a similar problem across

the state. Why does it take a rise in the fines to curve this?

JERRY agreed with Rep. Thorpe and said it should not take this but unfortunately they feel the

need to do something.

REP. SCHMIDT mentioned that a bus can call someone in who doesn't yield the right of way.

Can't ambulances do the same?

JERRY said yes.

REP. WEISZ questioned the number of ambulances involved in accidents in the last year? How

many of them involved fatalities?

JERRY was unsure.


