Minutes:

Senator Klein called the meeting to order roll call was taken, 3 members were absent.

Senator Klein opened the hearing on SB 2423.

Senator O'Connell introduced the bill. Protect generic form of seed. Wanted Iowa's bill

introduced but couldn't be done. Trying to protect the ready roundup seeds that are coming up.

Need to protect people who have done the research. May need some amendments.

Bill Kuntz from the State Seed Department spoke in favor of the bill. Under the current situation this is best in the state seed department because this legislation is already there.

Senator Wanzek: Would this require them to know the quality of seed and what kind of seed

they are cleaning?

Bill Kuntz: There is a form called an indemnity form that seed conditioning plants use to try and protect themselves.

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Senator Wanzek: That would allow to minimize concern?

Bill Kuntz: That's correct.

Senator Wanzek: This would require mostly those people who are just conditioning common seed, not conditioning certified seed.

Bill Kuntz: Right.

Senator Wanzek: Your amendments are going to remove the necessity to file with the Ag. Commissioner.

Bill Kuntz: The amendment would be to license by the seed department instead of the Ag. Commissioner.

Senator Sand: I am assuming the seed include potatoes, lentils, beans and so forth.

Bill Kuntz: Not include potato, but it would include every other crop.

Senator Kinnoin: Is there a bond requirement for these seed conditioners to carry?

Bill Kuntz: Not unless they are handling grain for market.

Carter Berg from Center spoke. Asked does Monsanto already have a licensing agreement with farmers that grow the roundup ready type products. Do we need to add another level of bureaucracy.

Bill Kuntz answered. Within the process of producing for Monsanto there is a licensing requirement.

Senator Klein: Is this creating another level of bureaucracy?

Bill Kuntz: It would require a license so yes that would.

Senator Wanzek closed the hearing on the bill.

Senator Wanzek reopened the hearing on the bill.

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Senator Sand: How many licensed plants are there in ND?

Bill Kuntz: We presently have over 140 approved seed conditioning plants and 120 applications

that are coming in now, another 10 mobile mills.

Senator Sand: You implied there are only 10 or 14 mobile mills that aren't registered.

Bill Kuntz: Right.

Senator Sand: I think there are more mobile plants than you imply.

Bill Kuntz: We work with a number of them.

Senator Wanzek closed the hearing on SB 2423.
