Minutes: CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH opened the hearing on SCR 4047. Appearing before the committee was SENATOR JUDY DEMERS, district 18, Grand Forks, prime sponsor of the resolution. A copy of her written testimony is attached. Also appearing in support of SCR 4047 was BARBARA KNIGHT, Grand Forks, President of the North Dakota Library Association. A copy of her written testimony is attached. SENATOR KILZER asked if Ms. Knight if she would envision to be incorporated in the umbrella electronic system for North Dakota? She indicated that her organization would envision that there would be some overall plan for the whole state for this. SENATOR KILZER, what I am kind of asking is, is this something that you would envision to be widely available rather than just kind of electronic microfilming type of thing?

Ms. Knight indicated we really didn't have an overall plan and that is why we thought it was something that needed to be studied. Obviously what we would like to see is that it would be widely available so that if you were studying something that happened now, fifty years from

now, that anybody that wanted to get access to that information could find it. One of the problems now is like if you have a document that comes out in electronic form somebody has it on a computer and even if you save it onto a floppy disc somewhere you have to have that material archived so that you know where it will be at if somebody wants to study it. Then also have it available to anyone that lives in the state who would want access. It's really important to be able to access some of those things. Just so that you know, sometimes when we look at things that are in the present we don't know what the thinking was when that item originated. So we do go back and look at the development of stages and try to determine what was the thinking of the people that proposed that. SENATOR DEMERS offered a comment and asked Ms. Knight if she might expand on the area of comment. Ms. Knight noted that DORIS OTT from the State Library would perhaps better be able to comment on this area. DORIS OTT, Assistant State Librarian appeared before the committee. According to century code 54-24-09 the state purchasing and printing agent shall deposit 8 copies of publications, all state publications with the state library. That is all publications produced by the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies. Those eight copies in turn, two of them are kept at the state library to be catalogued and the other six are deposited with the historical society, the universities and with the library of congress. What is happening at the present time is that some state publications are being put on web sites and are not being printed on paper which means they are not being deposited at the state library, which in turn means we can not access them. We have some questions concerning this and would like to see this addressed. Some of those questions are is anyone retaining this information, if so who is retaining the information and how can it be accessed? There are other questions that need to be answered thus the need for this study. There was no further testimony

WHO ARE WE:

NDLA, the North Dakota Library Association, is the North Dakota affiliate of ALA, the American Library Association.

The purpose of the organization is to exercise professional leadership and to promote library services and librarianship. Our membership is open to any person or organization interested in supporting the purpose of the Association.

How many are we: 389 members belong to NDLA and its 10 divisions which represent: public libraries, school libraries, small libraries, academic & special libraries, health science information, government document information, information technology, technical services, new member services, and library trustees.

What is unique about us: Each of us represents an individual library with similar and yet unique missions. Because of that we sometimes see issues from a view point representative of our unique customers - much like legislators view issues from different perspectives.

Why are you hearing from us: At NDLA's 1998 annual conference the membership voted to adopt the following resolutions, which represent priority concerns of the membership:

Resolutions:

- * Recommend full funding for the 1999-2001 biennium in legislation to support statewide library networking and services outlined in Library Vision 2004 and communicate this position to the Governor's Office.

 Info: This biennium the State Library asked for \$125,000 as a line item and an additional \$125,000 in its supplemental budget request to continue LV2004 goals and objectives. The Governor's Executive Budget accepted both, recommending \$250,000. This will allow us to begin implementation of Phase 2 of Library Vision 2004.
- * Encourage the North Dakota Legislative body to fully fund State Aid to Public Libraries at \$1.6 million in the 1999-2000 legislative session.

Info: The State Library requested \$1 million; the Governor's Executive Budget recommends \$887,300.

- * Encourage the Office of Management and Budget, the chairs of the House and Senate appropriations committees, the Lieutenant Governor, and the Governor to appropriate funds for the inclusion of the holdings of the State Archives and Historical Research Library in the ODIN database.
- * Ask the Legislative Council to study the issues of preservation and extended access to state publications in electronic format and report its findings and recommendations, together with any implementing legislation, to the Fifth-seventh Legislative Assembly.
- * Encourage the North Dakota legislature to retain mill-levy funding.
- * Maintain that the school library media specialist's credential guidelines and rules remain high or be raised even higher.


This is a truly interesting issue. Instead of trying to figure out what to do with all the paper (as we have for years), we now are trying to figure out the best means and timing for capturing what we have.
