TESTIMONY

Mr. Chairman and members of the committee:

Good Morning, my name is Susan Anderson, Legal Counsel with the North Dakota Insurance Department. I stand before you today to introduce House Bill No. 1144.

Section 1 of House Bill No. 1144 will codify the federal requirement that all health insurers in the group and individual market that provide medical and surgical benefits for mastectomies to provide benefit coverage for:

- Reconstruction of the breast on which the mastectomy has been performed;
- Surgery and reconstruction of the other breast to produce a symmetrical appearance;
- Prostheses and physical complications for all stages of mastectomy, including lymphedemas.

Health insurers doing business in this state are required to provide these benefits because of federal law, specifically the Women's Health and Cancer Rights Act (WHCRA) amendment to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA).

The passage of House Bill No. 1144 will allow the Insurance Department to enforce the

requirements of WHCRA.

We are also offering certain amendments shown on the attached sheet. The amendments introduced today have been discussed with the ACLI and Blue Cross Blue Shield. The amendments are to clarify that the WHCRA provisions do extend to all individual or group major medical policies but do not extend to limited benefit plans such as disability income policies.

The second section permits group and individual carriers to modify coverage at renewal if the modification is deemed reasonable and to require carriers that are modifying coverage to notify the Department so that we can be informed of such changes prior to the carriers mailing notice to the affected employers, participants, and beneficiaries.

We ask for your vote in favor of House Bill No. 1144.
