Fees collected from this program have been identified in the executive budget. Projected total collection is \$200,000. Revenues will be reduced by \$44,556. from 1999-01 Biennium due to change in Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-know Act (EPCRA) reporting requirements. Loss of this fee revenue would require a general fund appropriation.

One-half of the funds collected by this program are pro-rated back to county emergency planning committees to enhance their hazardous material preparedness and response capability.
