

Chairman Kelsch: We will now open the hearing on HB1235

Rep. Hawken: (District 46) This bill is dealing with how we currently label buses. This bill has affectionately been known as 'a bus is a bus'.

Dan Huffman: (Asst. Superintendent with the Fargo school district) For years the Fargo public school district has transports thousands of kids that live within the incorporated city limits of Fargo. We've done that out of necessity, as a means for parents of children in the district to be able to get their children to our facilities. We've done it for safety reasons, because with the numbers of children we have in our buildings and the size of those buildings, it's a lot safer environment surrounding those schools; they have one or two buses dropping kids off as opposed

to 50-60-70 cars. We've done it so that children from single parent families and from two parent families where both parents work, actually have access to educational opportunities, and we did it out of conservation, because it is more energy efficient globally to transport hundreds of children in buses than one or two children in cars. For years, we received no state reimbursement for that transportation that we ran in the city limits. Two or three sessions ago, we were successful in getting recognition in getting these buses as a cost to the school district, and we began to receive a payment of \$.25 per mile for those large capacity buses that run inside our city limits. To us, there is no difference in running a large capacity bus whether it runs down a city street or a rural road, in fact, I think that one could certainly argue that it's probably less energy efficient to do the starts and stops inside a city than it is to run it down a highway. What we're asking is that all buses that transport kids be treated the same no matter what the capacity and whether or not it's inside or outside of the city limits. We have a very significant transportation system in Fargo. Our buses run 460,000 miles a year when you combine the miles we drive in the city limits and those we run on our rural routes. Over those miles, we transport between 2000 and 2500 students every day. We provide transportation to our larger attendance area elementary schools and to all of our secondary facilities.

Rep. Nottestad: If this bill would pass, what about districts that have the opportunity to contract with city bus services. Would that be incorporated into this?

Huffman: I do not believe so, because a city bus does not need the definition of a school bus for safety perspectives and all of those other kinds of things. A city bus route is not exclusively for the use of a school, and it doesn't meet the definition of school bus, so I do not believe it would.

Rep. Thoreson: (District 13) This also runs a considerable amount in our district. In our particular situation, we have approximately 130,000 miles that we transport students, which, for our community is quite significant, and about 30,000 miles of that is within the city of West Fargo, and there again, we have to make up the difference in our school district, which takes away from other things that we would prefer to use that money for for educating our students.

Chairman Kelsch: We will now close the hearing in HB1235.



This bill eliminates the in-city category for transportation reimbursement and allows reimbursement at the same rate as rural transportation.

The additional cost is estimated at \$.42 per mile (\$.67 rural - \$.25 in-city) x 550,000 annual in-city miles reimbursed. This comes to \$231,000 per year or \$462,000 for the biennium. No additional cost is associated with changing reimbursement from \$.40 per pupil day to \$.20 per ride.
