Minutes: CHAIRMAN FREBORG called the hearing on HCR 3002 which directs the Legislative Council to study the completed revision of those provisions of Title 15 of the NDCC which relate to elementary and secondary education for the purpose of reconciling any inconsistencies or irregularities.

Testimony in support of HCR 3002:

ANITA THOMAS, Legislative Council Attorney, explained the resolution. This directs the Legislative Council to check for inconsistencies or irregularities and if there are any changes that need to be done. SENATOR COOK asked if this legislature makes a change that has some adverse effect on an individual or school or school board, is there some language that can be put in HB 1045 or HB 1046 that would exempt a party if the effect of the law is adverse to them. Is there a way to protect the general public or the entities involved in the legislation. MS. THOMAS stated that there is always a chance for a problem with any legislation passed. That is why this resolution is necessary.

One of the things that experience has taught us is that no matter how careful we are and no matter how many eyes look at a document, there will be some inconsistencies and some irregularities. We're not anticipating many. Last time we had five sections that contained errors -- those include the typographical and the "OOPS we should have caught it but we didn't". As you can see from the reconciliation bill, there were a number of other sections that were not incorrect, but which could benefit from some clarification.

The interim education services committee asked for this study resolution to provide a forum for any changes that still need to be made.
