REP. AL CARLSON, CHAIRMAN Opened the hearing.

REP. GIL HERBEL, DIST. 16. Introduced the resolution. This resolution will provide a study on how evaluations of ag land are assessed, determine the equities and inequities within what we now call the "formula" that establishes the way in which valuations are established throughout the entire state of North Dakota. The people in my district, not to belabor the point, are very disgruntled in what is happening with evaluations. What we are asking here, is that the legislative council take a look at the formula and make adjustments for items that have not been included in the formula, which primarily deal with unplanted acres and unharvested acres at the result of flooding.

REP. CARLSON Is this the way resolutions are normally worded, that it directs them, but still gives them the discretion to pick.

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REP. HERBEL Yes, it doesn't guarantee it. I visited with John Walstad for an extended period

of time. The indications are that this is probably something that will be addressed.

REP. CARLSON It is hard to separate them sometimes because it is not only the assessed value

but also the funding of education off of that property. It all kind of entertwines. I imagine that

would be part of the study.

Senator Urlacher: Opened the hearing on HCR 3047, directing Legislative Council to study the property tax assessment and valuation of agricultural property.

<u>Representative Gil Herbel</u>: Co-sponsored the bill, testified in support. Provided handout and explains it. We need to take a look at Agland property tax. The formula does not take into consideration the difference between planted acres and harvested acres. Property taxes are out of control and need to be studied.

<u>Senator Nichols</u>: Is it possible that the harvested acres and planted acres could be a big part of what's hard to figure out? When you visited with those people, did they indicated that that could be most of the answer or are there other things involved?

<u>Representative Gil Herbel</u>: The formulation is distorted because they don't take into consideration difference between planted and harvested acres. Senator Nichols: It seems like there has to be something more involved.

<u>Senator Christmann</u>: Is it your goal to adjust the formula or to go back to going by valuation? <u>Representative Gil Herbel</u>: Not necessarily get rid of the formula, but make changes within that might address inequities. Whatever might be best to make it equitable.

Senator Wardner: This is startling. How can the value go up if there's no production.

Representative Gil Herbel: I don't know what the answer to this is.

Senator Urlacher: It seems as though there's something within the formula that we haven't

identified that's having some drastic effect.

Senator Kroeplin: I think they're applying the harvested acres to the planted acres.

Senator Christmann: Had a few questions on the handout. Is there something new in Pembina County that pays a lot of property taxes? Walsh County's taxes levied went up so much when there down with the rest of the counties in valuation growth, isn't that because the voters there chose to give the school an unlimited mill levy?

<u>Representative Gil Herbel</u>: To a certain degree, you are correct. Grafton has nearly half of the population of Walsh County. We have a very small school district trying to educate all those kids. Without the support necessary from the state, we've been forced to raise the mill levies. Pembina has the Crystal Sugar Beet Plant.

Senator Christmann: Has that plant been built since 1980?

Representative Gil Herbel: It's been there longer than that.

<u>Senator Christmann</u>: It seems like there must be something in Pembina County since 1980 because the valuation went up so much more than the rest of the counties.

Representative Gil Herbel: Pembina gets flooded more.

Senator Herbel is talking about. It's important to take a look at the formula at this time. <u>Wade Moser</u>: ND Stockman's Assoc., testified in support. We would like an opportunity to take a look at the formula. <u>Marcie Dickserson</u>: State Tax Dept. I am aware of one major piece of construction that took place in the last couple of years. There has been a large expansion of Lake Head Pipeline in Pembina County. <u>Senator Christmann</u>: Is that natural gas? <u>Marcie Dickserson</u>: That's oil.

<u>Representative Joyce Kingsbury</u>: Co-sponsored the bill, testified in support. I'm from the area

Senator Urlacher: Closed the hearing. Action delayed.

Senator Christmann: The reason that their productivity continues to be high is because of the disaster payments.

Senator Urlacher: I feel the whole tax structure needs to be looked at and Legislative Council can decide what to study.

2001 TESTIMONY

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Representative Herbel,

I see that you are a sponsor of HCR 3047.

If this communication seems to be in a bit of an "elevated voice", 1 apologize but so be it.

The blue sheeted hearing schedules which the M & M Boys brought home

did not have the hearing for HCR 3047 scheduled. I learned of 3047 by reading the House Journal by electronic means. I see by the electronic hearing schedule that 3047 is to be heard at 9:30 on 2/13. I will not be there, but it is only a study resolution anyway. I have already been

through the scheduling difficulties of HB 1246 Capitalizaton Rate which I also discovered by electronic means. I am saving my gas and energy for SB 2068. I do ask that you possibly consider this as testimony if possible.

The mathematical concepts of the agricultural land valuation process

are understood by few, but are subject of political comments by many. To do a study is fine. I support that.

I do ask that in the study process that you do not duplicate some of the apparent problems in SB 2068 Inundated Ag Lands.

In the study process please find some that can read well enough to discover the importance of the February first date in the assessing process. That may lead to the elimination of any emergency clause in any proposed legislation.

If any legislation is proposed, please find someone to write well enough that I can read and understand the proposal well enough to avoid going to interim study committee members to get a clue as to what is being discussed, as I have had to do on SB 2068. I am not impressed with that document. I am sure my high school and college English instructors would not give it good grades. My daughter, who was in Honors English in high school, and is now taking Erglish Compositon in college, is not impressed.

If any legislation is proposed, please find someone versed in arithmetic well enough to avoid the appearent discrepancies in SB 2068.

That covers reading, writing, and arithmetic.

I realize that this is not three hole punched. I do ask that you consider it as testimony in support of the resolution.

In the scheduling for hearings, to maximize my inputs, it would help to have both SB 2068 and SCR 4010 heard on the same day. To minimize my input, schedule them on different days.

Hopefully someone on the committe will discover this message in time for the hearing.
