REPRESENTATIVE MERLE BOUCHER of District 9, cosponsor of HCR 3059 introduced a RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO STUDY WATER CONCERNS AND NEEDS OF NORTH DAKOTA. He stated he has put together a package of five resolutions each addressing one aspect of very critical infrastructures within North Dakota. These areas would be water development, transportation, technology, education and medical services. He feels it is a joint effort between private and government if the state is to have sound economic development. The resolution calls for the study of our state's resources, our issues and our capacity for future growth.

There was no neutral or opposing testimony of HCR 3059.

SENATOR FISCHER closed the hearing on HCR 3059.

Testimony For House Concurrent Resolution No. 3059 Prepared For The House Natural Resources Committee Represented Rennerfeldt, Chairman

Good afternoon Chairman Rennerfeldt and members of the House Natural Resources Committee. For the record I am Merle Boucher a member of the House of Representatives, elected from District Nine.

There are many factors that are vital to the preservation of our state's current economy and North Dakota's potential for future growth. Our ability to sustain our current population and the possibility of expansion during the decades to come is closely linked to our states infrastructure.
