TESTIMONY BEFORE SENATE HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE

SB 2093

January 15, 2001

Chairman Lee and members of the Senate Human Services Committee, I am Muriel Peterson, Program Administrator of the Aging Services Division, with the Department of Human Services. One of my responsibilities is responding to matters pertaining to "assisted living."

Senate Bill 2093 corrects an error in North Dakota Century Code section 50-24.5-01(2), which provides the definition of an assisted living facility. Subdivision (e) should reference chapter 23-16, licensing of medical hospitals by the State Health Department, but instead incorrectly references chapter 23-20, pertaining to radiation. Chapter 23-16, essentially states that if a facility is licensed by the State Health Department, it is not subject to the requirements of Chapter 50-24.5.

The Department of Human Services requests that the Committee gives this bill a "do pass" recommendation. I will be available to answer questions the Committee may have.

TESTIMONY BEFORE HOUSE HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE

REGARDING SENATE BILL 2093

February 16, 2001

Chairman Price and members of the House Human Services Committee, I am Muriel Peterson, Program Administrator of the Aging Services Division, with the Department of Human Services. One of my responsibilities is responding to matters pertaining to "assisted living."

Section 1 of Senate Bill 2093 corrects an error in North Dakota Century Code section 50-24.5-01(2), which provides the definition of an assisted living facility effective July 1, 2001. Subdivision (e) should reference chapter 23-16, licensing of medical hospitals by the State Health Department, but instead incorrectly references chapter 23-20, pertaining to radiation. Chapter 23-16, essentially states that if a facility is licensed by the State Health Department, it is not subject to the requirements of Chapter 50-24.5.

Sections 2 and 3 are necessary in order for the corrected citation to coincide with the effective date of the statutory definition, July 1, 2001.

The Department of Human Services requests the Committee give this bill a "do pass" recommendation. I will be available to answer questions from the Committee.
