SENATOR TALLACKSON; Sponsor, introduced this bill to the committee.

LANCE HAGEN; Agriculture Coalition, testified in support of this bill.

DUANE MAATZ; Red River Valley Potato Growers, testified in support of this bill. We have two part that we are looking at one deals with sanitary regulations and another deals with relating to the transfer of certified seed between a seed grower to a commercial grower then to another commercial grower. We are requesting that the commissioner require all seed potatoes shipped into the state from another country carry a shipping point inspection certificate, plant health certificate and a sanitary certificate. The certificate must include the seed lot and grade as well as the date of inspection. Adding this language to the Potato Seed law makes the ND law consistent with the resent implementation of federal law through USDA AFIS.

MIKE JORDE; testified in support of this bill.

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SENATOR WANZEK; When a grower buys certified seed from out of state is it seed that is certified within their state rules and regulation, does it come with a label?

MIKE JORDE; Yes, there is a grade but that is another issue nationwide that certified seed dealers are dealing with. The grades are not the same in all states.

SENATOR WANZEK; The intention of the amendments is to limit this to seed potatoes, not commercial potatoes?

MIKE JORDE; As far as I know all we are talking about are seed potatoes.

BRAD NELSON; testified in support of this bill.

KIT MIDGAIDEN; Commercial Grower, testified in support of this bill.

SENATOR WANZEK; Do you feel as a commercial grower this will help protect against any potential disease problems?

KIT MIDGAIDEN; Yes, disease in potatoes is a serious problem. We all have to police it whether it is the seed growers, commercial grower, everybody.

The hearing was closed.

SENATOR KLEIN moved the amendments to this bill (10779.0101).

SENATOR ERBELE seconded the motion.

Discussion was held.

SENATOR WANZEK; I understand what the intent is and the substance of the amendments. I would hope that they are doing what we think they're doing, which is to narrow the scope down to seed potatoes, not all potatoes.

SENATOR KLEIN; I believe they are.



The conference committee on SB 2389 was called to order by SENATOR ERBELE. Others in attendance were SENATORS KLEIN, KROEPLIN and REPRESENTATIVES

BRANDENBURG, KINGSBURY and SANDVIG.

SENATOR ERBELE; The amendment we are discussing is 10079.0201 that was placed on in the House. Would anyone care to address the amendment from the House and provide some information?

REP. BRANDENBURG; On Page 1 line 1, remove, create and enact a new section to Chapter 4-10 of the North Dakota and also on Page 1 line 2 remove Century Code, relating to seed potato inspection; and to and also remove lines 5-11.

REP.KINGBURY; We did just talk about lines 5 - 11 and they we advised by the Agriculture Commissioners Office that it was already taken care of in federal law and was unnecessary to be in there. Up here this apparently doesn't create and enact a new section that's why if it is

corrected because this was left out then it is just a bill for an act to amend and reenact Section 4-10.

SENATOR ERBELE; So it really doesn't significantly change.

REP. KINGSBURY; That apparently had to be changed with the other changes.

SENATOR ERBELE; I believe be taking that out then it is constant with taking out 5 - 11. If you look at the back of your testimony there is some other testimony relating to what is already addressed in federal law.

REP. KINGSBURY: On 5 - 11.

SENATOR ERBELE; Any other discussion? Rep. Brandenburg, you were talking about an emergency clause is anything else we need to consider there?

REP. BRANDENBURG; I asked and visited with Rep. Lloyd and he never asked about an emergency clause. He did recall that there was any discussion on that and I see that we didn't but that in there.

SENATOR ERBELE; What date will the emergency clause move us to?

REP. BRANDENBURG; As soon as the Governor signs it.

SENATOR ERBELE; As soon as the Governor signs it, it becomes effective?

REP. KINGSBURY; It will take care of potato season which would be good.

SENATOR ERBELE; Would that create a hardship for any growers now that who have already bought?

REP, KINGSBURY; No, it wouldn't.

SENATOR KLEIN; The only thing that is left is to allow a seed grower to transfer to another grower who wants to, that is the only thing it would do because we have gutted the inspection side.

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REP. KINGSBURY; When would go into law?

SENATOR KLEIN; It wouldn't go into law until August 1st.

REP. BRANDENBURG; I see that Senators Holmberg and Tallackson are the main sponsors of the bill. Maybe we should check with them before add an emergency clause?

SENATOR KROEPLIN; We should talk to Senator Tallackson.

REP. BRANDENBURG; Just so we do this right since this is Senator Tallackson's bill I think we should make sure that we should make sure that we do this right.

SENATOR KLEIN; Maybe there is a way can call the Potato Growers and they could respond to us, they are really the ones that probably move this forward.

REP. KINGSBURY; I could call the person who brought this in, he is on the Potato Growers

Board I could call him very quickly and get an answer from him.

SENATOR ERBELE; Please do that, we will be at ease for a few minutes. By putting an emergency clause on it, it doesn't effect anyone this spring that would create a hardship.

SENATOR KROEPLIN; Actually I think the bill makes it easier for them.

SENATOR ERBELE; OK, and I think it probably would.

SENATOR KROEPLIN; And legalize what they are doing already.

SENATOR ERBELE; If we are not creating a hardship I think we should go ahead and put it on.

REP. BRANDENBURG; I am not sure that we can add the emergency clause after a conference committee.

SENATOR KLEIN; We would accede to the House amendments and amend.

REP. KINGSBURY; Mr. Chairman, they would very much like the emergency clause added on, that would work for this season.

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SENATOR ERBELE; It seems like we have a very good workable situation and I would be

looking for a motion them to accede to the House amendments and further amend.

The Red River Valley Potato Growers Association is requesting language changes in the North Dakota Potato Seed Law.

S.B. 2389 requests that the:

Commissioner shall require all seed potatoes shipped into this state from another country, to carry a shipping point inspection certificate, plant health certificate and a phyto sanitary certificate.

The certificate must include the seed lot and grade as well as the date of inspection.

Adding this language to the ND Potato Seed Law makes the ND law consistent with recent implementation of the federal law by APHIS. Historically, ND seed potato growers have been required to have these certificates and testing completed before exporting seed. This would require imported seed to carry the same requirements. The addition of this language would ensure only clean, disease free seed enters ND, as well as helping to level the playing field for seed trade.

Proposed changes to Number 3 should read:

3. The commissioner shall permit a North Dakota potato grower to sell or otherwise transfer certified rotato seed to another ND potato grower. The recipient grower may plant the seed only for commercial production. The seed is not eligible for re-certification or retention as seed for the following production cycle.

The intent of this proposed change is to allow a potato grower to sell overrun quantities of seed to another grower. This is a common practice between friends and neighbors, but it is also illegal under the current law. It is practical to allow a single transfer of seed to another grower in regard to disease control, timeliness and proper disposal.


This seed could be planted for commercial production only. The seed would not be eligible for re-certification and could not be retained for planting in the following year.

Seed growers are not opposed to this transfer as they would have made the original sale of the seed they produced. Commercial producers favor this change as it allows them to recoup a portion of their seed cost and avoid the cost and time of properly disposing of leftover seed potatoes.

There is support from seed growers, commercial growers and the ND Seed Commissioner. We have met to discuss and agree on these proposed changes.

Testimony: SB 2389
North Dakota State Seed Department

As pointed out by the RRV Potato Growers Assn., the objective of SB 2389 is to bring ND into compliance with federal requirements under APHIS. Also, the bill is intended to put the same requirements for inspection and documentation on imported seed as is required of North Dakota seed being shipped interstate or international.

However, SB 2389 as currently written may create confusion, and unintended consequences for the industry.

- The changes are intended to apply only to imported seed. The changes should therefore reference Chapter 4-10-06.3 specifically, and not apply to Chapter 4-10-06.4.
- It is impractical, if not impossible, to require that imported seed be inspected at the border. The intent of the request has been to require the same documentation of imported seed as is required of our exported product; shipping point (grade) inspections, health certificates and phytosanitary certificates. Authority for the designation of official shipping point inspection sites is already allowed under 4-10-07 and 4-10-09.

The easiest way to modify SB 2389, and accommodate the original intent of potato growers, would be to replace the language as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 4-10-06.3 is amended as follows:

Imported seed potatoes- Certification requirement. All seed potatoes imported into this state for planting purposes by any person from any state, territory, or country must be accompanied by an official shipping point inspection (grade) grade certificate describing the grade, seed lot, and date of inspection of the potatoes or , a health certificate and a phytosanitary certificate (as defined in Chapter 4-09) to certify that the lot of seed potatoes was field inspected by an official certifying agency and is similar to the standards established by this chapter for seed potatoes.

These changes will allow the original intent of the legislation to be achieved, while removing unintended problems of the original draft language.

The second issue, involving seed transfer, is supported by the Seed Department.
