

On the change on line 17 as you know OMB submitted a bill to do the very same change, we didn't realize they were going to do that.

Chairman Klein: what we did in this committee, is we did pass out HB 1075 which addressed that specifically, so what we would do is delete that portion of it.

<u>Kurt Wolfe:</u> we have no anticipation of borrowing any money, but the limits in here as to in excess of 1,000,000 dollars and having to budget section approval up to that cap of equipment line.

We ask for two changes, one is line 22 include implementation services, along with equipment and software, and second just a % of overall budget as attached. At this point we have no anticipation of major purchases in the next bi-enium. Appropriation request is at approximately at \$108,000,000, so we are looking at slightly over \$10,000,000 with authority to borrow if the details in here are followed through.

On line 18, we still do some support for mircofilm for agencies, there may be a point where we eliminate it or out source it. In that case we might want a language change in it.

Representative Kasper: Who owns ITV?

Kurt Wolfe: State agencies.

Representative Grande: Federal dollars, are they off of grants?

<u>Kurt Wolfe</u>: where we are looking for Federal Grant dollars, is in the Criminal Justice program, that we have in our budget.

Representative Sitte: Who are the 8 members appointed by the Governor? ?Are they private citizens, or agency heads?

<u>Kurt Wolfe</u>: I don't have the list that the Governor appointed, I did council with him as to who the people should be with privat sector people on there.

We have only had one meeting with this particular advisory group.

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Mr. Chairman and members of the committee, my name is Roxanne Woeste. I am a fiscal analyst for the Legislative Council and was the committee staff for the 2001-02 interim Information Technology Committee, which recommended the introduction of House Bill No. 1043 relating to the powers and duties of the Information Technology

Department, information technology plans, and the State Information Technology

Advisory Committee. I am here today to provide you with a brief summary of the bill.

Section 1 of the bill amends North Dakota Century Code (NDCC) Section 54-44.6-01 by changing the reference for the responsibility of establishing a statewide forms management program from the Office of Management and Budget to the Information Technology Department (page 1 line 18).

Section 2 of the bill amends subsection 4 of NDCC Section 54-59-05 by:

- Inserting the language "implementation services" on line 22 to provide that the Information Technology Department may purchase, finance the purchase, or lease – equipment, software, or implementation services.
- Changing the language regarding the amount that may be financed to provide that the purchase amount may not exceed 10 percent of the amount appropriated to the department during that biennium. (The statute currently provides that the department may finance the purchase of software, equipment, or implementation services only to the extent the purchase amount does not exceed the amount appropriated to the department during that biennium for equipment.)

Section 3 of the bill amends NDCC Section 54-59-11 relating to information technology plans to change the due date for plans from March 15 to July 15. (page 2 line 24 and page 3 line 3)

Section 4 of the bill amends NDCC Section 54-59-14 to remove language referring to "central microfilm unit equipment and supplies" because according to the department the department is no longer investing in this kind of equipment and supplies.

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Section 5 of the bill draft repeals NDCC Section 54-59-07 relating to the State Information Technology Advisory Committee.

Mr. Chairman, that ends my brief presentation, and I would attempt to answer any questions at this time.

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54-59-07. State information technology advisory committee.

The state information technology advisory committee consists of the chief information officer or the officer's designee, who is a nonvoting member; the director of the department of commerce division of economic development and finance or the director's designee; the commissioner of higher education or the commissioner's designee; the chairman of the information technology council of North Dakota or a designee; the director of the North Dakota workforce development council or a designee; the chairman of the educational technology council or a designee; and eight members appointed by the governor. The appointees of the governor serve at the pleasure of the governor. The governor shall designate the chairman of the committee. The department shall provide staff services to the committee. Except for the commissioner of higher education and the representatives of state agencies who receive compensation for their duties as state officers or employees, members of the committee are entitled to be compensated for time spent in attendance at meetings of the committee and for other travel as approved by the chairman of the committee at the rate of sixty-two dollars and fifty cents per day and are entitled to reimbursement for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the same manner as other state officials. The compensation and expenses are to be paid from appropriations for the department. The committee shall advise the department regarding statewide information technology planning, including providing electronic government services for citizens and businesses, developing technology infrastructure to support economic development and workforce training, and developing other statewide information technology initiatives and policy.
