Minutes:

Rep. Weisz. Chairman opened the hearing on HB 1046 a bill for an Act to Amend and reenact section 39-09-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to speed limitations.

Rep. Delmore appeared as a member of the Judiciary B interim committee which spawned this bill. She represents District 43 in Southwest Grand Forks. The committee looked at the 75 mph speed limit. The Committee also looked at the changes that are in this bill as it was passed out of committee. The changes are found on page 2 in lines 12 and 13, and then again in lines 15,16 and 17. Basically it maintains a 65 mph on paved two lane highways and paved divided multi-lane highways unless otherwise permitted, restricted, or required by conditions. It keeps the same during dusk hours. She asked for favorable consideration of this legislation by the committee.

Sen. Trenbeath representing District 10, also a member of the interim Judiciary B committee appeared in support of this bill. Rep. Delmore gave nearly of the details of the bill. The committee recalls and accepts that the proposed increase to 75 mph on the Interstate was vetoed

otherwise restricted. The driver is still required to drive according to weather and conditions. However, 65 is the maximum not the minimum. He recommended a 'do pass' for HB 1046.

Rep. Weisz. Chairman called for further testimony either for of against, there being none he closed the hearing on HB 1046. (4.4)

Rep. Weisz. Chairman (42.2) opened the discussion on HB 1046. Rep. Ruby like the uniformity provided in this bill. He noted that some people in the past session did not like the higher speed limits during the night time nonetheless he liked the uniformity of speed limits throughout the state.

In answer to discussion questions and concerns, <u>Rep. Delmore</u> stated that curves, restricted speed zones and other limiting conditions are already at this time signed and posted.

Rep. Delmore: Moved a 'Do Pass' on HB 1046. (44.4) Rep: Hawken. Vice Chairman seconded the motion.

On a roll call vote the motion carried 12 Ayes, 1 Nay 0 Absent.

Rep. Delmore was designated to carry HB 1046 on the floor.

Minutes:

Chairman Senator Thomas Trenbeath opened the hearing on HB 1046 relating to speed limitations.

Representative Lois Delmore (District 43) introduced HB 1046 which is basically a simple bill increasing the speed limit to 65 mph on paved two-lane highways and on paved and divided multilane highways, unless otherwise permitted, restricted, or required by conditions. That includes being able to drive 65 mph on those roads at night. It is a maximum speed limit, not a minimum.

Tim Dawson from Legislative Council spoke to explain the bill. He was neither for nor against the bill draft. The bill removes the 55 mph nighttime speed limit on paved two lane highways unless otherwise posted.

Senator Trenbeath asked if the default speed on two lane paved roads would be 65 mph instead of 55 mph.

Tim Dawson replied that was correct. It would be 65 mph all the time instead of 65 mph daytime and 55 mph at night.

There was no opposition to HB 1046.

The hearing on HB 1046 was closed.

Discussion clarified that the speed limit on gravel roads stays at 55 mph. As to signs, it wouldn't be a matter of creating any signs but some would have to be taken down.

Senator Bercier moved a Do Pass. Seconded by Senator Espegard. Roll call vote 6-0-0.

Passed. Floor carrier is Senator Bercier.
