N.D.C.C. 50-11 relates to licensing of foster homes for children and adults. 50-11-07 now deals with license revocation, and is silent on license denial. Unfortunately, we do encounter situations where an application for a family foster home license includes false, misleading or incomplete information. In those instances, license denial is appropriate if we are to adequately protect vulnerable children and adults in care.

While we have accomplished denials by relying on other sections of 50-11, we recommend this housekeeping change to 50-11-07 to clearly state the basis for foster home license denial.
