Minutes: Chairman Keiser opened the hearing on HB 1279.

Rep. Wrangham, District 8, introduced the bill. This makes changes to comply with federal government OMB classifications and definitions in regard to the ND Hearing Aid Society.

Ronald Schauer, a local hearing aid specialist and past president of the ND Hearing Aid Society, offered favorable support for HB 1279. (See attached) He suggested an amendment which has the approval of the board of the ND Hearing Aid Society: Lines 3 & 4 on page 7, section 10.

**Rep. Klein:** What kind of funds are you talking about?

Ronald Schauer: I'll defer that question to the current president of the NDHAS.

**Doug Schauer**, offered oral testimony in support of HB 1279. Last fall the NDHAS asked for the name change that would keep them consistent with the national level. At that time they also discussed using some of their board funds for further continuing education to certain

Rep. Klein: How many members are presently registered in ND and what are your annual fees?

Schauer: We have a total of 63 licensees, including hearing aid dispensers and audiologists. Our

Rep. Klein: How much money do you have in your funds at present?

Schauer: We have about \$30,000 in our checking account. Our last litigation cost us about \$20,000.

Chairman Keiser: How will the board determine to keep enough in reserve to handle potential litigation as well as do continuing education?

Schauer: \$30,000 is enough for us to remain solvent.

As there was no one else present who wished to testify either in support of or in opposition to HB 1279, the hearing was closed. Rep Klien commented that the amendments are already within the language of the bill.

Rep. Klein moved a do pass on HB 1279. Rep. Zaiser seconded the motion. Results of the roll call vote were 14-0-0.

Rep. Klein will carry this bill on the floor.



## NORTH DAKOTA HEARING AID SOCIETY

Mr. Chairman, ladies and gentlemen of the committee, I am Ronald Schauer, Hearing Aid Specialist with a practice in Bismarck. I am a past president of the North Dakota Hearing Aid Society and past chairmen of the North Dakota Hearing Aid Specialist Examiners board.

I am here in favor of HB 1279. In 1999 the United States government office of Management and Budget in order to provide continuity in the Hearing Aid Profession classified those that are licensed to dispense Hearing Aids in the United States as a "Hearing Aid Specialist" and added them under the Health Care Practitioner and Technical Occupations section of Health Occupations.

This bill is offered to upgrade 43-33 to be in compliance with that change.

In regard to the change in 43-33-14 this change is made for clarification of disbursement of funds by the board. The Board is already authorized in 43-33-14 to disburse funds. Clarification of this section is requested so that these funds are specifically used for continuing education. When I presented this change to Mr. John Walstad of the Legislative council he saw no problem the way 43-33-14 is currently written but said it would be acceptable to clarify this point.
