Senator Urlacher (mtr #1555) - You are suggesting a mechanism similar to the fuel tank issue, where they were not able to buy insurance for liability purposes. Where a portion of your licensing fee sent in towards a fund to build for the purpose of bonding?

Representative Schmidt (mtr #1590) - That was changed, that organization no longer buys a bond, they buy errors and omissions insurance. Talked about a fund for auctioneers for the bond. Auctioneers do not like to use their bond as they would be out of business.

Senator Wardner (mtr #1741) - Example, if I started a bonding company, would I have to be bonded?

Representative Schmidt (mtr #1753) - Not sure of that. It is hard to find a company that sells bonds. Western Surety of SD is the bonding company most use. We are sending youth, cattle, and money out of state.

Senator Wardner (mtr #1861) - Regarding the North Dakota risk insurance fund, is that what you envision?

Representative Schmidt (mtr #1881) - The ND Insurance Reserve Fund has been mentioned, but we as auctioneers don't know the direction to take. Decided to put a bill together to address.
