Resolution celebrating the 100th anniversary of Theodore Roosevelt's presidential election.

Roosevelt assumed the office of President on September 14, 1901 after President William McKinley was assasinated on September 6th, 1901, at the age of 42.

Roosevelt became the 26th President of the United States and was sworn into office at about 3:15 p.m. at the Ansley Wilcox Mansion in Buffalo, New York, making him the youngest man ever to become President (John F. Kennedy was the youngest man ever elected to that office at the age of 43). Roosevelt was re-elected President on November 8, 1904.

Next year would be the 100th anniversary of Theodore Roosevelt's presidential election.
