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Senator J. Lee (mtr #1250) - Opened the hearing on HCR3054. All committee members are present. This resolution directs the Legislative Council to study the state's public health unit infrastructure and the ability of the public health unites to respond to public health issues, including disease and other physical health, environmental, and disaster-related issues. Representative Clara Sue Price (mtr #1324) - Introduced the resolution. Has to do with emergency powers. Bill was brought to light due to an incident last year in Minot with Anhydrous. Brought home what we did right and what things we lacked. There are a variety of issues that we don't consider on our everyday life. Referenced a chart labeled Local Public Health Units. Copy attached. A lot of issues in front of us such as West Nile Virus. Want to explore a better partnership between public and private providers within the medical arena. Urges a do pass by the committee.

Keith Johnson, Administrator for Custer District Health Unit (mtr #1704) - Testified in favor of HCR3054. Applaud Representative Price for bringing this forth. Unit is charged with ten core functions. Uniform response to bio-terrorism is one of our charges. Referenced the same chart that Representative Price used and talked about the single county and multi county districts. And areas they serve. Currently is not a uniform structure in place for place health practitioners. Urges a do pass by the committee.

Senator J. Lee (mtr #1981) - Explain briefly the difference between the city/county health department and the city/county health district?

Mr. Johnson (mtr #1990) - A health department operates under the structure of the government that governs either the city or county. Gave further detailed explanation of how the city/county health departments work together. A city/county health district is set up as a separate structure with a separate board of health. That board of health meets to decide budgets, program activities etc.

Senator J. Lee (mtr #2070) - Why chose one over the other.

Mr. Johnson (mtr #2079) - Is biased towards health districts because works with a board of health that is very concerned with the wok of the district. When a department of a county of city, may have a hard time getting your issues considered. City/county have a ton of other issues to consider.

Good Morning Madam Chair and members of the committee. I am Lisa Clute, Executive Officer of First District Health Unit. I am here today to voice my support for HCR3054.

The responsibilities of local health units have changed substantially since September 11, 2001. The majority of my day is now spent planning for bioterrorism threats and events, training staff and the medical community on small pox vaccinations, arranging for lab tests of suspicious materials, and community disaster response planning. Now we work closely with fire departments, police departments, highway patrol, sheriff departments, hospitals and emergency managers.

On January 18, 2002 a train derailed in the Minot area, which resulted in an unprecedented public health threat to the community. Our public health system was challenged and as a result I believe we have valuable information to share regarding the role that local health units must be prepared to assume in a disaster.

HCR3054 will put local health departments "under a microscope" and that's a good thing. We have the responsibility to assure that local public health units are ready and able to respond to not only disasters and bioterrorism threats, but also any public health threat (i.e. food borne outbreaks).



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
