SENATOR TOLLEFSON opened the hearing on HCR 3058.

REPRESENTATIVE KRETSCHMAR HCR 3058 is the backbone of the executive article of the 1972 Constitution. That article attempted to do, and was not approved by the vote of the people, restructure the executive branch of the government into a maximum of 18 departments. Every agency, commission & committee would be placed in one of those departments. Since the constitutional convention, there have been some attempts to consolidate departments. If this resolution were approved by this committee and the legislature, placed on the ballot and passed, state government would not have changed much. This would be an ongoing project for many years. It took from 1976 to 2001 to get a unified judicial system in place. If this were approved by the people, I do not think it would be a massive change in government overnight. The other section of the bill establishes the state planning council in North Dakotas. I think it is time that we put this to a vote of the people.

SENATOR SEYMOUR As you look at your number of 18, why didn't you make it 14.

REPRESENTATIVE KRETSCHMAR I think because in our state we elect a number of state officials, and each one of those agencies would have to be one of the departments. That is an arbitrary number.

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REPRESENTATIVE WINRICH In line 21 -m 25 you describe a procedure whereby the Governor may make changes in the statutory provisions of the legislature. It says the change must be submitted to both houses of the legislative assembly on the same day. What happens when the legislature is not in session.

REPRESENTATIVE KRETSCHMAR The executive order would not be in effect until the legislature has signed it.

REPRESENTATIVE WINRICH I wonder if the requirement that the change must be set forth in the executive order. Does that prohibit the Governor from issuing an executive order.

REPRESENTATIVE KRETSCHMAR I believe it would.

SENATOR TOLLEFSON Some of these resolutions are difficult to understand, difficult to vote on, how would you get that word out.

REPRESENTATIVE KRETSCHMAR It would have to be an educational process through groups, the press. I agree with you, it is easy to get a good explanation out.

REPRESENTATIVE ECKRE Getting back to the question of the legislature having 30 days to

disapprove the order, is there a way to change this.

REPRESENTATIVE KRETSCHMAR I am sure that there is.

CHUCK FLEMING I am a private citizen of North /Dakota. I have had a long time interest in government reorganization. When I was involved in state government, I offered a resolution to reorganize the executive branch of state government. I don't believe there is a person in th's room that has a private business that organizes their business in such a manner. I do think the resolution that was introduced and passed in 1989 might be better language. A one time comprehensive plan seems to me to make more sense. I think it would be the greatest legacy a governor could have in trying to modernize state government. The last time we modernized state government was in the 1960's. This is important, because you have scores and scores of commissions and boards that are violating the law every day. They don't have a full time executive director, the open meetings law, the problem of fiscal matters, it is a disaster waiting to happen .I think the political climate is right to do something, in what ever form you might take.

REPRESENTATIVE KRETSCHMAR I will have an amendment drafted, and we will figure something out.

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
