David Munsch testified in opposition to SB 2352 stating he has nothing against gratis licenses but things seem to be getting out of hand.

Dennis Daniel testified in opposition to SB 2353 stating things should go back to gratis as it was originally given, if you deeded the land you got a license.

Paul Schadewald, Chief of Administrative Services for the North Dakota Game & Fish Department presented the committee with an amendment for SB 2353. This amendment corrects an oversight of the limited family partnerships being included in the bill. He gave some history of the gratis licenses with about 11,000 license being issued each year. The Game & Fish needs direction from the legislature as to how this is handled.

Senator Joel Heitkamp stated that these people who no longer get the gratis license can still get the license through the lottery.

Senator Tollefson closed the hearing on SB 2353.

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the Senate Natural Resources Committee.

For the record, my name is Terry Weis, and I have asked that this bill be drafted because of the unintended consequences of Estate Planning with Farmers and Ranchers.

Many times when planning to reduce the Estate Taxes the Estate Planning Attorney will suggest using a FAMILY LIMITED PARTERSHIP as a tool to freeze the value of the farm or ranch assets. This reduces the value of the land by 20 % to 25 % from Dad (the general partner), to Children, (the Limited partners).

The problem has come the following year when these individuals apply for a gratis deer permit on their land. Game and Fish has been unable to issue these farmers and ranchers a gratis permit because of the tile of the land.

All of a sudden those involved with the Estate Planning Process have caused an unintended consequence.

The way the bill reads now Family Limited Partnerships are not included and I believe that there are some amendments that would rectify the problem so SB 2353 would allow these farmers and ranchers to get a gratis license.

SB 2353 WOULD ALLOW FARTNERS IN A FAMILY LIMITED PARTNERSHIP THE ABILITY TO GET A GRATIS DEER LICENSE.

I ask for your support for a DO PASS from the committee.

Good morning Mr.Chairman and members of the committee.

For the record, my name is Patrick Hoffman. I am a North Dakota resident and landowner.

A Family Limited Partnership (F.L.P.) is an estate-planning tool, approved by the Internal Revenue Service. The single purpose of a Family Limited Partnership is for parents to reduce the estate tax burden by transferring ownership of their assets to their children or children's family. This will make it easier for the children to retain ownership of the family assets, and continue farming or ranching.

Under current interpretation, a family who takes advantage of a Family Limited Partnership may not be granted a ND gratis permits.

Example: A rancher owns several sections of land on which he has raised his family. He and his wife intend to leave their assets to their children. Their two children are now actively ranching with him. They are each eligible for a gratis permit, and can hunt together on the family ranch.

To lessen the estate tax burden, the parents create a Family Limited Partnership and begin transferring ownership of the ranch to the children. Under current law, no gratis permits can now be issued to the parents or the children. Nothing has changed except the family planning for the future.

A family who plans for the future and attempts to insure retained ownership of their assets should not be treated differently than any other landowner in ND.

I ask you to support SB 2353 with the amendment to allow gratis permits for members of a Family Limited Partnership only.
