Minutes: CHAIRMAN FREBORG called the committee to order. Roll Call was taken with all (6) members present.

VICE-CHAIRMAN G. LEE opened the hearing on SB 2371 relating to a county equalization factor.

Testimony in support of SB 2371:

SENATOR FREBORG, spoke in support of SB 2371. He stated this is similar to the old 21 mill county equalization levy, only this is 20 mills. This bill should be amended because with the bill as written, you will equalize on all the property in your district within county lines. That will not work. On line 8 and 9, subsection a. should read: Determine the product of twenty mills times the equalized taxable valuation of property in the school district whose administrative headquarters are in the county; and...

We are at a point where equity is needed and he feels if the state does nothing to at least start to remedy this, the court will do it.

SENATOR COOK asked how many states are in litigation over equity. He also asked how we lost the 21 mill deduct. SENATOR FREBORG said that measure 6 passed in the 1980's did away with it.

Testimony in opposition to SB 2371:

TOM TRACY, Supt. Kensal Public Schools, feels this bill will hurt small schools.

SENATOR COOK asked if Kensal is a "rich" or "poor" district. MR. TRACY stated that Kensal is "rich" in taxable valuation per pupil and "poor" in amount of students (low enrollment). He further stated that they were against the discussions in the interim committee relating to having 64 school districts in ND. SENATOR COOK asked if Kensal is accredited. MR. TRACY stated they are accredited but had, for a couple months, been accredited warrant.

SENATOR FLAKOLL stated that it is not only small schools that could get hurt by this legislation, the largest school district in ND would be slightly down turned. MR. TRACY feels the net effect of this bill along with other legislation being proposed, would be detrimental to small schools.

SENATOR FREBORG asked if MR. TRACY would have a better answer or if prefers the courts to decide. MR. TRACY stated he has not studied the equalization question enough.

SENATOR FREBORG stated the factors that are driving consolidation are the inequities in education both in quality, the mill levy, minimum standards, finance, minimum course offerings.

MR. TRACY feels the issue is urban vs. rural.

SENATOR FREBORG asked if he supports increasing teacher pay to equalize dollars. MR. TRACY would like more answers to his issues.

SENATOR COOK stated there is no bill in the legislature to consolidate to 62 school districts. It was brought up as an idea during the interim and decided it would not be good for ND schools.

JEFF BATA, President of Kensal School Committee, compared commercial property vs. agricultural property and their valuations. He sees some federal dollars going as unequal. He stated that they would lose dollars with this bill and would have to place it on the local property owners.

DEAN BARD, ND Small Organized Schools, wonders how to bring equity to our system. He brought up the Wyoming Plan, which he thought would work, but it was found to be unconstitutional. He feels the effect of this bill would be immediate, long term and bad for small schools.

SENATOR COOK asked if MR. BARD could tell him how many schools would benefit from this bill. He stated he has no figures. SENATOR COOK asked how do you determine which side of an issue to be on as a representative for small schools. MR. BARD presented the brochure put out by ND Small Organized Schools which states there should be no increase in the mill deduct until the state reaches a level of funding that equals or exceeds 70% of the statewide average cost of education. He stated we are now at about 45% of that. The value of all local tax abated real property should be included in the calculation for state foundation aid entitlements.

SENATOR COOK pointed out this is not a state equalization, it is a county equalization factor.

SANDY CLARK ND Farm Bureau, presented testimony. (see attached)

SENATOR FREBORG asked if Farm Bureau was supportive of Measure 6. She wasn't sure.

SENATOR COOK stated this is a county equalization issue. He asked how she decides which position to take. Their policy is to oppose any increase in mill deduct levy. The policy is

developed at a local level and continues to the state level at their state convention with the delegates making the decisions. SENATOR COOK asked if she felt her members know what the mill levy deduct is all about. MS. CLARK stated she hopes so and has put together a little pamphlet on such. She is sure not all understand the formula, but some do.

There was no further testimony on SB 2371.

The hearing on SB 2371 was closed.

SENATOR FREBORG stated that if the mill deduct bill can pass, he would rather equalize funding that way.

SENATOR COOK proposed an amendment: line 9, after "property", insert "in the school district whose administrative headquarters are". Seconded by SENATOR FLAKOLL.

SENATOR FREBORG asked for this to be drafted exactly like the old 21 mill county equalization levy and he was told that it didn't work. He wondered how it had worked for 20 years?

Roll Call Vote on amendment: 6 YES. 0 NO. 0 Absent. Amendment adopted.

JERRY COLEMAN, DPI, explained how this would work. The first printout given to the members matches the amended bill. It adds 20 mills so there is a 52 mill deduct at the state level, and then 32 and 20. The second printout compares 32 mill deduct only and adds the additional 20 mills. The second printout tries to show what happens if you add 20 mill deduct at the state level or as a county equalization. If you have a district that is in one county and part of another, the monies will go into the other county also. It will roll up all of the taxable value of the

districts if they had their administrative headquarters centered in that county. So it does go across county lines. DPI would have to do the county deduct separately with the allocation. This would be different from how the formula is set up right now. Using the data sheet from DPI, MR. COLEMAN took the committee through it by column. Looking at what the 20 mill deduct does, (columns County Level Equalization, County Redistribution) it totals up all the deduct that the county generates and how it is redistributed based on the number of students they have. The equalization is how you deducted the money, and then the redistribution is how that went back out. This is all done within the county. The 20 mills is generated at the county level basis, and that turns around and redistributes it back within that county. This keeps the boundary lines and the students together.

SENATOR FREBORG stated the committee needs to know the net effect over a 32 mill deduct, if you add the 20 within the county.

The committee was adjourned.

SENATOR TAYLOR moved a DO NOT PASS as Amended. Seconded by SENATOR G. LEE.

SENATOR FREBORG doesn't know why this isn't workable. For years the state had a 21 mill county equalization levy that worked. However, Legislative Council stated when going outside county lines to include all of the district, it becomes cumbersome.





Testimony by North Dakota Farm Bureau presented by Sandy Clark, public policy team

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. For the record my name is Sandy Clark and I represent North Dakota Farm Bureau.

North Dakota Farm Bureau policy states "we oppose the mill levy deduct system in support of a more equitable distribution of tax dollars and oppose increases in the deduction level." Therefore, we oppose SB 2371.

North Dakota Farm Bureau opposes any increase in the mill levy deduct. This bill would increase the mill levy deduct from 32 mills to 52 mills.

While this equalizes between "property poor" and "property rich" school districts within a county, those "property rich" districts will be severely impacted by those districts in the county that are "property poor" with high enrollment. Any increase in the mill levy deduct has a negative impact on property taxes of ag land.

We have appeared before this committee previously on mill levy deducts, so in the essence of time, we will simply reiterate our position and encourage a "do not pass" recommendation on SB 2371.
