PROSECUTION WITNESS FEES INFORMATION **2003 SENATE BILL NO. 2417**

- Prosecution witness fees and expenses are reimbursed for district court criminal and juvenile court cases.
- For the 2001-03 biennium \$100,000 was appropriated to the Office of Attorney General for this purpose.
- As of February 28, 2003, \$ 107,000 was reimbursed for prosecution witness fees and expenses.
- The Emergency Commission approved \$10,000 for this purpose in September 2002 and requested that this Office return to request the additional amount needed in December 2002, however there was no December meeting.
- Based on average usage, an additional \$33,000 in General Fund moneys will be needed to reimburse prosecution witness fees for the remainder of the 2001-03 blennium.
- The Office of Attorney General 2003-05 biennium appropriation bill contains \$100,000 for prosecution witness fees reimbursement.
- Previous biennia prosecution witness fees expenses totaled:
 - \$121,356 for the 1999-2001 blennium
 - o \$166,501 for the 1997-99 biennium, and
 - o \$175,422 for the 1995-97 biennium.
