Wayne Stenehjem, Attorney General testified for the bill. This bill would appropriate money in the general fund for the purpose of defraying prosecution witness fee expenses incurred by cities and counties. This is declared an emergency. These fees run about \$6,000 per month. They will run out of money in February. This is just a pass through to the local counties through the Attorney General office.

Motion by Senator Tallackson for a do pass, seconded by Senator Christmann. Roll call vote was taken, which is attached. Motion carried with 12 yes, 0 noes, 2 absent and not voting.

Senator Christmann will carry the bill to the floor.

PROSECUTION WITNESS FEES INFORMATION
2003 SENATE BILL NO. 2417

- Prosecution witness fees and expenses are reimbursed for district court criminal and juvenile court cases.
- For the 2001-03 biennium \$100,000 was appropriated to the Office of Attorney General for this purpose.
- As of February 28, 2003, \$ 107,000 was reimbursed for prosecution witness fees and expenses.
- The Emergency Commission approved \$10,000 for this purpose in September 2002 and requested that this Office return to request the additional amount needed in December 2002, however there was no December meeting.
- Based on average usage, an additional \$33,000 in General Fund moneys will be needed to reimburse prosecution witness fees for the remainder of the 2001-03 biennium.
- The Office of Attorney General 2003-05 biennium appropriation bill contains \$100,000 for prosecution witness fees reimbursement.
- Previous biennia prosecution witness fees expenses totaled:
 - \$121,356 for the 1999-2001 biennium
 - \$166,501 for the 1997-99 biennium, and
 - \$175,422 for the 1995-97 biennium.
