SCR 4018 urges all publicly supported entities having food acquisition functions to support North Dakota producers and processors through the purchase of food products grown or produced and processed in this state.

Senator Klein introduced the bill. He states that this bill is not suggesting a mandate, but to suggest and urge state entities to buy ND products for their parties.

Senator Andrist stated his support for the bill.

Ken Junkert, ND Agriculture Commissioner's office, spoke in support of the resolution. He stated that this resolution would bring about more awareness and encourage schools to look to local growers for their products.

Senator Espegard: Aren't a lot of these businesses too small to handle the demands of these entities?

Ken: These businesses would have to be assessed on an individual basis.

Testimony for SCR 4018 Presented by Rep. Mike Grosz February 11, 2003

Thank you Chairman Mutch. Members of the distinguished Senate Industry, Business, and Labor committee, for the record my name is Mike Grosz, representative for District 42, the northwest portion of the city of Grand Forks.

Mister Chairman, in theory I agree whole heartedly with SCR 4018. However, I believe your committee should know as many facts on this subject as possible before voting. In my "real life" occupation, I am the accountant for the Food Service's department at the University of North Dakota.

It is from this perspective that I have learned that such a subject isn't as simple as it seems. During the purchasing process, there are numerous factors that must be taken into account. Some manufacturers provide value added services, such as coolers, freezers, shelving, point of sale materials, menu ideas, and recipes just to name a few. Take for example frozen yogurt. One company may provide yogurt at a few cents less per gallon, but the other company will provide the \$8,000 dispensing machine for free. For most of our food purchases, the University of North Dakota goes through a prime vendor to minimize costs, and thus minimize the cost to the students. This prime vendor may not do business with some manufacturers due to many reasons ranging from consistency of supply, the ability to demonstrate HAACP procedures (federal safety and sanitation policies), and pricing on a national corporate level.

We do work closely with our prime vendor to ensure they are purchasing and providing as much North Dakotan products as possible. On the reverse side of my testimony is a sample list of the North Dakota products being used at UND.

Another factor is that our menu development process is very student driven. Our Food Service staff and student representatives attend an annual food show that displays new menu options. Students provide feedback on the products which they wish to have, and we make every attempt to meet those needs to ensure a happy customer.

Many manufacturers do not want legislative preferences given to purchasing patterns as it goes against our capitalistic society. Imagine if North Dakota starts a nation-wide trend of states mandating that that state must use their products. What will that do to our national or global capitalistic market, and where will that leave North Dakota?
