Keith Lauer: We checked with the Charitable Gaming Association annual convention and they felt this is reasonable. All we want to do is replace special funds that will be depleted this biennium. We just want to offset these costs. We already have the appropriation for that. Some of that appropriation special funds is for inspection of Native American casinos, we have a little bit of added cushion in there in case we have to do some major investigations. We do have special fund authority already in our budget, so there isn't a problem there with the cap there, I don't think there will be a problem.

Representative Zaiser: You feel comfortable that will offset the additional costs that are occurring in the gaming industry.

Keith Lauer: Yes.

Representative Meyer: Just for clarification, these small towns that have Calcutta, do they have to pay a \$200 fee, or is it if they have a series of 10, would it be just one \$200 fee or would it be a \$1,000 for them.

Keith Lauer: Yes they would in case of a Calcutta because it is a stamped game. There are local permits and charity local permits, which do not require the state license. But those are unstamped products, the stamped products are Calcutta's and pull tabs, and so other game types like sports pools, bingo, raffles can be done under a local permit, provided that the prizes don't exceed \$12,000/yr. So small organizations that do those types of activities, do not have to pay this fee.

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

The bill has been approved by the Judiciary Committee, 14-0, and has been referred to House Appropriations, Government Operation Division because of the fiscal note. **Chairman Carlisle** General Discussion Page 2 House Appropriations, Government Operations Monday, January 24, 2005

said the \$68,000 in question is already included in the operating expenses of the Attorney General's budget. **Chairman Carlisle** said he would carry the bill to Full Committee. There was a question as to why two fiscal notes were attached to the bill, one dated 12/22 and the other dated 1/12. **Chairman Carlisle** called **Kathy Rowe, Director of the Finance & Administration Division** and asked if she would come to the House Conference Room and explain. When she arrived, she explained what happened with the first fiscal note was that the \$204,000 that goes into the general fund for this fee was reflected, and it was already included in the executive recommendation. The Dept. revised it to just include the \$68,000, which is the fee increase. She confirmed that the operating expenses for HB 1089 are already in the A.G.'s budget.

He described the provisions of the bill which increases the annual gamin license fee for each city or county by \$50. The increase will be deposited into the Attorney general's operating fund which would offset depleted special funds to cover operating expenses.





TESTIMONY ON HOUSE BILL NO. 1089

By Keith Lauer, Gaming Division, Office of Attorney General

House Judiciary Committee January 10, 2005

My name is Keith Lauer. I am Director of the Gaming Division of the Attorney General's Office. I am testifying on behalf of the Attorney General's Office in support of House Bill No. 1089, and will describe the provisions of this bill.

- This bill increases the annual gaming license fee for each city or county from \$150 to \$200. The most recent change in the gaming organization license fee was in August 1989, when an increase from \$100 to \$150 was approved (16 years ago).
- The \$50 increase per year must be deposited into the Attorney General's operating fund and is estimated to increase revenue in the amount of \$68,000 (1,361 gaming licenses issued during the 2001-03) for the biennium.
- 3. The increased revenue would be used to offset depleted special funds used in the current biennium in order to continue offering the gaming organizations a toll-free telephone number to our division, on-site and regional training to gaming organization employees and board members, and on-site inspections during audits and investigations.
- 4. Although our division continually looks for ways to cut operating expenses increases in the risk management premium, telephone costs, postage, and other necessary office expenses continue to increase.
