Chairman Mutch opened the hearing on HB 1258. All Senators were present with the exception of Senator Nething.

Representative George Kaiser introduced the bill on behalf of Representative Todd Porter. The bill deals with regulating dental hygienists. He distributed an amendment to the committee for consideration. The original language of the bill would create a problem since some clinics do not have 51% ownership.

Senator Heitkamp- Do we still need the bill after the amendments?

Representative Kaiser-Yes, this bill deals with the regulatory concerns for dental hygienists.

Jerry Kettleson, Counsel for Dental Examiners and Asssistant Attorney General, appeared before the committee in support of the bill.

Senator Klein- Did everyone in the groups agree on the solution?

Jerry- Yes. The dental association has been studying this issue and came up with a series of resolutions.

Chairman Mutch- It seems that the problem is that some are not paying their license fees each year.

Jerry- That is not a problem.

Senator Espegaard- On section 5, dental hygienists can do just about anything under the supervision of a dentist. Is a dental assistant the same as a hygienist?

Jerry- No. There are certain things a dental assistant is not allowed to do.

Senator Krebsbach- So, it appears to me that the dental assistants are being separated into their own section of the bill?

Jerry- Yes.

Senator Krebsbach- How long have dental assistants been around?

Jerry- They have always been around, the dentist has always been responsible for the dental assistant on the type of work.

Chairman Mutch- Do dental assistants have to be licensed?

Jerry- Yes.

Joe Cichy, Executive Director of the ND Dental Association appeared in support of the bill.

Senator Espegaard- So, this bill would give the dental assistants more leeway, under the direction of the dentist?

Joe- That's correct. By giving additional duties to the assistant, the dentist does not have to be present when the work is being done, they can visit another patient.

Senator Krebsbach- What is the difference in the educational standards between a dental assistant and a dentist?

Joe- The dentist is a graduate from a 4 year college and 4 years of dental school in addition to a residency. A dental assistant can go through a two year training program offered at Wahpeton college.

Chairman Mutch- Does the dental assistant have to pay a license fee?

Joe- I don't believe so. Only when they go to the advanced levels, they would need to be certified by the board.

Chairman Mutch closed the hearing on HB 1258.

House Bill 1258 Relating to the Regulation of Dentists, Hygienists and Dental Assistants

Chairman Keiser and members of the Committee, my name is Joe Cichy (#220) and I am the executive director of the North Dakota Dental Association. I present this testimony in support of House Bill 1258.

The North Dakota Dental Association has been working to address the dental access issues in our state. One success is the Donated Dental Services program, through which volunteer dentists have donated nearly one quarter of a million dollars in dental care to over 100 people in the past two fiscal years. This program is designed to help the elderly and people with developmental disabilities who are unable to access care through other programs and unable to afford the care. The NDDA also participates in the national Give Kids A Smile program, which is designed to screen, educate, and treat children who are otherwise unable to access dental care. Dentists in Fargo have set up an urgent care clinic, which provides voluntary services to people with acute dental needs. This urgent care clinic prevents what would eventually become a considerably more expensive and less productive trips to hospital emergency rooms. Grand Forks dentists also provide access to urgent care through partnership with the Third Street Clinic. In Bismarck, Bridging the Dental Gap started this fall and is seeing low-income patients. Additionally, dentists on their own provide free or discounted dental services daily in their private offices to those who may not have the means to cover the costs of the care.

This bill is another piece of the puzzle to improving access to dental care. It gives the Board of Dental Examiners the ability to regulate dental assistants and define their

scope of practice. Presently most of the duties assistants perform must be under the direct supervision of the dentist. This bill will give the board the authority to allow certain duties performed by assistants to be done without the direct supervision of the dentist, thus allowing the dentist to see other patients. The dentist would still be responsible for directing the assistant. However the efficiency of the office would be greatly improved allowing more time for the dentist to care for more patients.

This legislation is another step by the dental community to create an environment that provides improved access to quality dental care by improving the efficiency in the dental office while still maintaining the high quality of care North Dakotans deserve and expect. The NDDA asks you to support this bill with a do pass recommendation.

This legislation is another step by the dental community to create an environment that provides improved access to quality dental care by improving the efficiency in the dental office while still maintaining the high quality of care North Dakotans deserve and expect. The NDDA asks you to support this bill with a do pass recommendation.

The amendment I would propose is to delete section 15 of the engrossed bill. This provision is addressed in HB 1200 which has passed the House and I believe should be on the Senate's Calendar. Therefore, so that two bills are not passed addressing the same code section, I ask that the attached amendment be adopted.
