Representative Kasper: HB 1336 was introduced in a bill that we past in the last session (1334) and what that bill did was mandated that employers collect the 9 digit zip code numbers from their employees and sent it into Workforce Safety and Insurance for a list, since the bill was past they have their own task force that they developed and are collecting their own zip codes down there and they really don't need this bill. This bill that I'm introducing simply repeals the requirement for employers to provide the 9 digit zip code which isn't being used anyway, I would urge a DO PASS.

Representative Johnson: On page three the retail section what does that detail?

Representative Kasper: Our bill is only on the repeal, on the bottom page 1, lines 23 and 24.



# Testimony on HB 1336 ND Motor Carriers Association, Inc. LeRoy Ernst, Managing Director January 19, 2005 Before the House IBL Committee


Chairman Keiser and members of the committee, thank you for the opportunity to express the trucking industry's input regarding HB1336.

The North Dakota Motor Carriers Association is the state trade association of the trucking industry representing every type of motor carrier in the state. Combined with NDMCA's allied members, we are an association of several hundred members - - most of which are small businesses.

The nature of our business is that many of our carrier members load and unload outside the state of North Dakota. Some of these carriers hire workers (lumpers) to load an unload their trailers. Many of these out of state workers may know their 5-digit zip codes but very few know their full 9-digit zip code.

Current law which requires our members to report to Workforce Safety & Insurance the 9-digit zip code only cause a great deal of extra work for staff looking up zip codes for people hired and work outside of North Dakota.

Mr. Chairman and members of the committee, we are not convinced of the benefit of the current reporting requirements to Workforce Safety & Insurance and request your favorable consideration of HB1336.



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
