Minutes: Chairman Mutch opened the hearing on HCR 3040. All Senators were present.

HCR 3040 directs Legislative Council to study the unemployment insurance tax rate structure.

Rep. Koppelman introduced the bill.

Rep. Koppelman: I have discovered the disparity in the unemployment tax that is paid by new businesses in the home building category particularly. We have done some research to find that not only are they penalized. Other businesses get a preferential rate. I believe it's 2.08%, which is the lowest rate in the state. The reason they do that is because people want to encourage new business. So when a business starts up we say, we are going to keep the unemployment tax low and we will assume you are innocent until proven guilty. You create a track record and if you lay people off and tap the fund, your rate is going to go up. If you don't, it's going to stay low. We do the opposite when it comes to people going into the construction business. One of the reasons constructions is all you know, it's been tough. Now, the reason, I would submit, is because there

are some people in heavy industrial construction, who regularly lay people off by the season.

They even have job attached workers. Which means, that it is planned that they do that. In the fall they go on unemployment and in the Spring they go back to work, and in the mean time, they draw unemployment. And because of that, the construction category, has a negative balance rating. When you start to slice the pie a little thinner and look at each individual category, you will find there are some that don't have a negative experience rating at all. One of those is home builders. Yet we charge them the highest rate possible under state law for unemployment tax. So our bill is sought to adjust that. We weren't trying to take it down to the low level that everyone else is at. Instead, they said let's look at a study where in the interim we can look at this.

Senator Espegard: You weren't proposing that the legislature sets the rates on unemployment, were you?

Rep. Koppelman: Actually, that's what happens now. They are set by statute.

Senator Espegard: I thought they were experience rated.

Rep. Koppelman: We restructured it in the last interim.

Senator Heitkamp: You couldn't find any Senators that agreed with you on this bill, or what?

Rep. Koppelman: Rep. Keiser sought the sponsors on this bill.

Dorreen Reidman, Association of Builders, stated her support for the bill.

There were no questions.

Senator Krebsbach moved a DO PASS. Senator Klein seconded.
