Chairman Holmberg called the hearing to order on SB 2353 which was rereferred from GVA based on senate rule 329-4.

Senator Rich Wardner indicated he had introduced the bill on behalf of the Secretary of State and he introduced the Secretary of State.

Al Jaeger, Secretary of State, testified on SB 2353. He indicated this bill came to appropriations because of some budgeting. He discussed the changes in the bill; Section 1, line 24 has some clarifying language, Section 3 allows to proceed with revoking notary commission, and the notary fee increase.

Questions were raised about the separate bookkeeping of the notary fees, the process of becoming a notary, notary charge back fees.

Leon Mulberg, notary, Dickinson testified against SB 2353. He indicated he had not heard about this bill, he does not charge for his notary services, but there are expenses of being a

notary. Also, he indicated no notification had gone out to notaries to let them know about the bill. He also indicated if the bill is not killed, he would suggest reducing the fees to -0- for becoming a notary. If the senate appropriations committee chooses to keep the bill and raise fees, he would suggest changing the duration of the commission to 12 years.

Questions were raised about the fees a notary charges, whether he thought notaries would give up their commission rather then pay additional fees.

Chairman Holmberg closed the hearing on SB 2353.

As of January 2005, the agency had 11,600 notaries listed in its database. Under current law, the fee to become a notary for a period of six years is \$25. However, the agency has greater annual expense than the annual average revenue of \$4.17 it currently receives for a six-year notary commission. The increase to \$36, or \$6.00 in annual revenue, will more adequately cover the expense of maintaining the records and providing the necessary services to notaries without other taxpayers subsidizing those services.

The fee was \$20 from 1983 to 1993, at which time it was raised to \$25. Therefore, it has not been adjusted significantly for 23 years.

The fee increase to \$36 for six years, or \$6 per year, compares to the average annual fee received in South Dakota, which is \$4.17 (same as North Dakota's is now), Montana and Kansas at \$6.25 annually, Wyoming and Nebraska at \$7.50 annually, Iowa at \$10 annually, and Minnesota at \$28 annually. The increase will still be lower than that in these six midwestern and plains states.

Al: They are bonded for 7500 hundred dollars, they take an oath of office.

Al: I was the one that did the calculating and if it doesn't match, I can go back and recalculate.

RE: SB 2353 - Notary Publics

The Secretary of State's office currently has approximately 11,600 notaries listed in its database. Each notary is issued a commission for six years and is considered an officer of the state.

Section 1: On page 1, line 9, the fee to become a notary is increased from \$25 to \$50. This fee has remained virtually unchanged for 23 years. In 1983, the fee was \$20 and it was increased to \$25 in 1993.

The reason for the increase is because it currently costs the agency more than \$4.17 it now annually receives (\$25 divided by 6 years) for issuing a six-year notary commission. The new fee will cover the increased expense of maintaining the records and will allow the agency to expand services and education for notaries.

<u>Section 2</u>: On page 1, line 24 and on line 1 page 2, the change makes it clear that it is an infraction whenever a person acts as a notary without a commission regardless whether it has been revoked or the notary is otherwise disqualified.

<u>Section 3</u>: On page 2, lines 26 through 29, allows the Secretary of State to proceed with a revocation of the notary's commission if he or she is convicted of a criminal offense, which has a direct bearing on the notary's ability to serve as a notary.
