Representatives Larry Bellew, Vice Chairman, Ralph Metcalf, Mary Ekstrom, Jon Nelson, Gary Kreidt, and Alon Wieland.

Representative Metcalf introduced the bill. He stated that it was a requirement for the Veterans' Home to spend all federal monies before spending any general funds. This is being asked to be removed. It affects mainly OMB and was effective two legislative sessions ago.

John Jacobson, of the Coordinating Council for the Veterans' Home, testified in support of the bill.

Kristin Lunneborg, Financial Manager of the Veterans' Home, asked for support of the bill.

Chairman Pollert: Suggested spending cap on Federal monies.

Kristin Lunneborg: No problem with this.

Continued discussion on procedure and which money was spent. The OMB look at balances on a quarterly basis and make necessary changes. OMB is in support of the bill. It was stated the Veterans' Home could only spend what is appropriated.

Chairman Svedjan opened the hearing on House Bill 1425.

Rep. Pollert reviewed the bill in Rep. Metcalf's absence.

Rep. Pollert: What House Bill 1425 does is the Veterans Home is the only agency that has to expend its federal and special dollars before General Funds. What this bill does is this takes that away and switches them back to the way all of the other agencies are done. The reason why we did this is that we went through the Veterans Home budget. That budget had a decrease in General Funds; it had a decrease in FTEs. They were doing a lot of things that we thought showed that they are doing their job. There were problems with the Veterans Home. They had some administrator problems, things were not working right and they went through two or three of them. It was kind of a vote of confidence for the committee and we thought we would bring it forward.

Rep. Nelson: I think the real recipients of passing this bill is OMB because they are the ones who have to code it correctly. There is no need to do that any more.

Rep. Klein: In passed sessions we have had many problems down there. I think we have straightened them out. I think it is time we let them get back in business.

Chairman Holmberg opened the hearing on HB 1425.

Senator Larry Robinson, District 24, Valley City, testified in support of HB 1425 on behalf of Representative Ralph Metcalf, District 24, Valley City. Senator Robinson stated there was language placed in law that meant the Veteran's home had to deplete all other funds before touching the general funds, circumstances change. He then indicated the purpose of this bill is to change wording in prior legislation and ease the administrative bookkeeping burden of the VA home. The bill received strong support on the House side and I strongly support this bill. Chairman Holmberg asked of Lori at OMB about the fiscal note. Lori indicated this allows the VA to spend appropriations like all other departments.

Kristin, Lunneborg, Accounting Manager, ND Veteran's Home, presented written testimony and testified in support of HB 1425 indicating that by removing prior wording they would then be treated like all other agencies. Currently they are the only agency that his this stipulation, secondly the ND Veterans Board has worked very hard to hire competent staff to manage the facility and are constantly looking at ways to save the facility and North Dakota money by renogiating contracts and doing competitive bidding for all other services and supplies.

Senator Bowman asked why this wording was on the legislation in the first place. The response was that in the past the Veteran's Home carried large balances and they don't see the need for going to the state to get additional general funds.

Chairman Holmberg and members of the Senate Appropriations committee, I am Kristin Lunneborg, Accounting Manager at the North Dakota Veterans Home. I am here today to testify on House Bill No. 1425, which relates to the Veterans Home's operating funds.

Currently, the North Dakota Century Code states that the Veterans Home can only expend general funds after it has expended all federal and special fund revenue. It also states that we must have approval from the Office of Management and Budget to expend any general funds.

It is my understanding that this clause was added to the Century Code within the last few years due to the lack of faith in the management at the Home. I am here today to ask you to please consider removing this clause for several reasons.

First, it is my understanding that we are the only agency in the State of North Dakota that has this stipulation. Secondly, I assure you that the North Dakota Veterans Home governing board has worked hard to hire competent staff to manage the facility and that we are constantly looking at ways to save the facility and the State of North Dakota money by renegotiating contracts, buying off the State's term contracts and doing competitive bidding for all other services and supplies. This stipulation also puts an extra burden upon the Office of Management and Budget. Due to the timing of our special and federal fund revenue, we often have to spend general funds on a monthly basis. It is very difficult to monitor when we need to spend general funds and in order to not have to contact OMB all the time, an agreement was made with OMB for us to code all our expenditures to special funds and they in turn would look at our fund balances and do the necessary journal entries to transfer money between funds. By removing this clause, OMB will not have the burden of monitoring these fund balances.

I ask that you please treat us the same as all other agencies in the State of North Dakota and remove this clause from the Century Code.
