All members of the committee were present.

Sen. Dever, Chairman, opened the hearing on SB 2235.

Al Jaeger, Secretary of State, introduced SB 2235. See attachment # 1. He mentioned that the equipment has tested well. It is usually human error of forgetting to initial ballots that has made the counts off.

Senator Nelson asked why it is important for the judge to sign the ballots.

Al responded that there is a level of security that this step adds to the process. He would rather err on the side of integrity of the process.

Senator Nelson asked if the number of ballots matched with the number of names in the poll

books, what would the problem be.

Al said she made a valid point.

Senator Dever said the ballot maybe should say right on it, "Make sure your ballot is initialed."

Al said the point is valid but if the count were ever too high, how would you decide what to

throw out and what not to. He wanted to be cautious about changing it.

Senator Horne mentioned that the fiscal note had about \$66.00 per county per election to test equipment.

Al Jaeger responded that they estimated 3 hours at \$22.00 per hour. This is a minimal cost.

They wanted to disclose it even though it is a minimal cost.

Senator Nelson asked how many polling places there are.

Mike Montplaisir, Cass County Auditor, responded there are 58 precincts and 56 polling places.

Senator Nelson asked how often they check that all equipment is working.

Mike said they are required by law to check all equipment the week before the election. They also retest them when there are recounts. They have done tests of a number of ballots, doing a manual count and comparing it to a machine count of the same ballots.



Concerning SB 2235

Chairman Haas and members of the committee, I appear before you today in support of SB2235.

With the implementation of the electronic voting systems statewide, testing of equipment has changed. Prior to the electronic voting systems in each precinct, we would tabulate ballots with a centralized electronic voting device. Testing would be performed on the equipment approximately one week before the election to ascertain that the equipment was tabulating correctly. Then on election night, prior to tabulating ballots, we would again perform a test on the equipment.

With the precinct level scanners presently being used, it is impossible for our office to perform the tests prior to tabulating the ballots on election day and also unnecessary since the programming chip is secured in each device after the public test. By having the random test performed after each election, this should provide a verification that the voting devices are tabulating correctly.

Mr. Chairman, I encourage your support of this bill.
