Bill Kretschmar~Representative from District 28. This bill is the result of a situation that came up in my community in 2008. An out of state nonresident could not open an establishment. It is unconstitutional to prohibit sole proprietors or individuals, who do not reside in North Dakota, from obtaining a liquor license. We want to remove the prohibition.

Kretschmar: If they had an ordinance, the current state law, this bill becomes law. It still would require living within the city limits. It helps rural towns where bar owners can be sole proprietors rather than corporations or LLC's.

Kretschmar: No they cannot.

Chairman Keiser: Sole proprietors are considered individuals.

Chairman Andrist: Called the committee to order, all members present, opened the hearing on HB 1345.

Bill Kretschmar: Representative District 28, introduced HB 1345. We had a situation in Ashley ND, where a gentleman from SD bought a restaurant and wanted to put in a wine and beer license in the dining room area in the back. We discovered in the statute if you were a non-resident individual, you could not get a liquor license in ND. We don't discriminate against foreign corporations or LLC's, so I felt this bill would solve the problem.

Chairman Andrist: So all this bill does is remove the requirement to be a resident of the state.

Senator Anderson: In my dealings, where I am from (Wahpeton) it was not uncommon for this to come up and the police department was always concerned that they wouldn't be able to find the owner if something happened where there was a violation of some sort. So the city of

Wahpeton has always enforced this, maybe it is an outdated law.

Bill Kretschmar: I would think that under the general law, that if someone was running the business in ND is subject to the jurisdiction of ND Courts because of that presence. I don't think there would be anything to worry about.

Senator Anderson: Would the cities have the authority to further restrict?

Senator Anderson: I knew about this and I should have done some investigative homework

on this. I apologize to you and the committee; I will make a few phone calls before I vote.

Senator Olafson: If there is a problem, and the local police dept. feels there is a problem and

they can't get a hold of the owner and they have good cause, can they not revoke the liquor

license immediately and shout business down until proper action is taken?

Bill Kretschmar: They most certainly could, however it would require notice and a hearing for

due process. The city does have that authority as well as the state of ND.

Chairman Andrist: Opened Discussion on HB 1345

Senator Anderson: This bill is the one that proposes to change laws regarding ownership of

liquor license by individuals. Right now as the law read, one has to be a resident of the state of

ND. I called and talked to the city attorney and he stated that it was a concern years ago and it

has been relaxed and is not in city ordinances anymore. What is in there is that there always

has to be a manager assigned on a liquor license. That manager has to either live within the

city or extra territorial zoning area. The reason for this is when there are violations; they have

to be able to contact someone immediately. I no longer have a problem with this bill.
