Representative Bette Grande: Don't we have this disabled veteran's property tax in Government and Veterans Affairs too? It is a very similar bill where we changed the definition.

John Jacobsen: It just changed terminology from value to taxable value.

Representative Dwight Wrangham: I don't remember the bill number but we have a bill in Governmental and Veterans Affairs. It includes in the definition some other aspect of being disabled that VA [precludes you from holding a job.

John Jacobsen: I'm not sure about that. I didn't read that part of it from the bill. The real value was changed to taxable value. The value went from \$125,000 down to \$5400 which would be the taxable value.

Chairman Wesley R. Belter: That is correct and that bill has already passed the House floor.

John Jacobsen: This one just removes the 50% disability and opens it up to all disabled veterans.

NORTH DAKOTA VETERANS COORDINATING COUNCIL

My name is John L. Jacobsen. I am the Chairman of the Legislative Committee of the North Dakota Veterans Coordinating Council. I am also a member of the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

I served in the North Dakota National Guard and the US Army Reserve for a total of 30 years. I retired in 1995 as a Colonel. I served on Active Duty in 1991 during Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm in the Persian Gulf, stationed in the United Arab Emirates.

The Coordinating Council is made up of 15 members, 3 from each of the five Veterans Organizations in North Dakota:

- American Legion
- AMVETS
- Disabled American Veterans
- Veterans of Foreign Wars
- Vietnam Veterans of America

It is the policy of the Coordinating Council to support legislation that will benefit the welfare of the members of the Armed Forces. The committee MUST concur totally, that is all 15 members must agree on the legislation to be supported or else it does not get the support.

In this case, I have been instructed to recommend to this legislative committee that a "DO PASS" on HB 1306 is supported by the Veterans Coordinating Council.
