#### Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

Relating to oaths of office of elected and appointed officials

#### Minutes:

Chairman Koppelman: We'll open the hearing on HCR 3009.

**Representative Conklin, Representative from District 4**: This is just a simple bill that is probably a housekeeping bill in some ways. There is no mention of the swearing in of the Executive Branch in the Constitution. This just adds Executive Branch to the offices that need to be sworn in.

**Representative Winrich:** Do you know if this is a wide spread practice? For example, I once served in a capacity where I swore in the members of an election board at a precinct polling place. I think it's already done. This would simply put it in the Constitution.

**Representative Conklin**: It's being done now. It's just not in the Constitution and somebody thought it should be. There's somebody on the radio in Grand Forks that is having a real problem with this.

**Chairman Koppelman:** I'm kind of resistant to sign on to Constitutional amendment resolutions because being in the position to chairing the committee but I thought this one was pretty harmless. Further testimony in support of HCR 3009? Any testimony in opposition to HCR 3009? Any neutral testimony on HCR 3009? Seeing none, we'll close the hearing.

#### Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

Relating to oaths of office of elected and appointed officials.

#### Minutes:

Chairman Koppelman: We will reopen HCR 3009. What are the wishes of the committee?

Representative Winrich: I move a do pass.

Representative Holman: I'll second it.

**Representative Kasper:** I missed this hearing. Could you refresh me on why this is needed? What is the problem?

**Chairman Koppelman:** My understanding is that oaths of office are sworn by most people now but there is no constitutional requirement for the other folks.

**Representative Conklin:** There is no need but it's just an oversight in the Constitution that it does not say that the executive branch has to be sworn in. They are being sworn in now but it's not in the Constitution that they need to be sworn in.

**Representative Schatz:** Is this going to go on a statewide ballot? This minor adjustment? Is that what this would do?

**Chairman Koppelman:** It would. Everything we approve here would have to go before the voters. I suspect that if you ask the voters, most would probably say yes. It would be on a ballot if we pass it.

**Representative Kasper:** I recall a debate on the floor not too long ago where a certain legislator was being chastised for overreaching the legislative authority into the executive branch. I find it ironic that we are going to make a Constitutional amendment and tell the executive branch they have to do the same thing we do.

Chairman Koppelman: It will be up to the people ultimately to decide that.

**Representative Meier:** Would this only include elected members of the executive branch? I couldn't find it in the bill.

Chairman Koppelman: I think this could be read either way.

Representative Conklin: I assume that it would be only elected.

**Chairman Koppelman:** Call the roll on a do pass recommendation on HCR 3009. Motion passes unanimously. We need to determine when this will go on the ballot. If it were to go on a general election so this would be in the 2012 election cycle on the fall ballot. We do have the option. We don't want to load up the ballot as we move on resolutions if we pass a number of these. Sometimes the sponsors consider that in terms of what ballot that they request the measure to be on.
