Chairman Weisz: Called the hearing to order on SB 2154.

Duane Hodek: Executive Secretary of ND State Board of Medical Examiners testified in support of the bill. (See Testimony #1)

Rep. Porter: The way that we set the board up with an A panel-B panel with even numbers. How is this going to affect that strategic set up you use for investigation and complaints with the 13 person on the panel instead of the panel of 6 and 6.

Duane Hodek: It will create an imbalance panel with 6 on one and 7 on the other but the balance you created in that statue will remain. It has worked very, very well. We have half the board which investigates the case and the other half serves as a jury and the deciding factor of the case. It will be Panel A because they deal specifically with Physician Assistants issues. The Physician Assistant will be put on this panel otherwise it will be the same.
