Chairman Lyson opened the hearing on SB 2282.

**Senator Tom Fischer**: Introduced the bill. The bill would raise the compensation of the members of the water commission which hasn't been done in several years. He proposed an amendment to the bill. See **Attachment #1**.

**Mike Dwyer**, representing the ND Water Users Association, urged support of the bill. The Commission allocates the budget, sets water policy, and furthers water development and water management in ND. A few years ago we secured legislation to tie most of the regional boards to legislative compensation but the Water Commission and the Atmospheric Resource Board were left out of that. This is an effort to bring them into line with the other regional water boards that we have.

**Senator Burckhart**: What is the amount provided for members of legislative management currently? You are going from \$62.50 to...?

Mike Dwyer: I think it is \$148.00 right now.

**Todd Sando**, ND State Engineer and Chief Engineer and Secretary of the State Water Commission, presented a written statement in support of the bill and the amendment. See **Attachment #2**.

Senator Burckhart: Is there a reason they have not been kept up to date?

**Todd Sando**: It has just been hard to get pay raises over the years.

**Darin Langerud**, Director of ND Atmospheric Resource Board, presented written testimony in favor of the bill and the amendment. See **Attachment #3**.

The proposed increase from \$62.50 to \$148.00 is \$85.50 per day. 147 days multiplied by \$82.50 is \$12,127.50. \$12,127.50 plus a 10% payroll additive totals \$13,340 per biennium.

## **Proposed Amendment to SB 2282**

Section 2. Amendment. Section 61-04.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

61-04.1-07. Board officers - Compensation. All members of the board, with the exception of the chairman, are voting members. The board shall elect annually from its membership a chairman, vice chairman, and secretary. A majority of the members constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting the business of the board. Board members who are not full-time salaried employees of this state are entitled to receive compensation of sixty two dollars and fifty cents per day in the amount provided for members of the legislative management under section 54-35-10 and must be reimbursed for their mileage and expenses in the amounts provided by sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09. All other members of the board must be reimbursed for necessary travel and other expenses incurred in the performance of the business of the board in the amounts provided in sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09.

Rep. Porter: We will open the hearing on SB 2282.

Mike Dwyer: I represent the North Dakota Waters Users Association. This bill is a bill to bring the State Water Commission and the Atmospheric Resource Board in line with a number of other boards in which their compensation is set by the legislative interim. The Water Commission meets about 7 times a year, they are high level meetings. The governor serves on it as well as the Commissioner of Agriculture and 7 citizens that are appointed across the state. The Atmospheric Resource Board meet 2-3 times a year, but they run the weather modification program of the state. We urge a Do Pass.

Rep. Nathe: When was the last time this was increased?

Mike Dwyer: We increased the water board in 1999. I would say this was 20 to 30 years.

Todd Sando: I represent the State Engineer and Secretary to the North Dakota State Water Commission. (See attachment 1). The fiscal note was about \$13,000. We meet in person 6-7 times a year, we also have conference calls and have 7 members appointed through the state.

Rep. Nelson: Are the conference calls meetings?

Todd Sando: yes the conference calls are meetings.

Rep. Nathe: How long are these meetings?

Todd Sando: The Water Commission meetings are usually ½ days.

Rep. Keiser: For the next session remind somebody to turn in an ominous bill that does this for every board.

Darin Langerud: Director of the North Dakota Atmospheric Resource Board, we are in support of HB 2282. (See attachment 2)

Rep. Porter: Is there any opposition? We will close the hearing.
