Chairman Jim Kasper opened the hearing on HCR 3012.

Rep. Marie Strinden appeared in support. **Attachment 1. (Article from the Bismarck Tribune)** It says they will be visiting the Grand Forks Air Force Base at the end of February and making their decision this spring. I am wondering if it might be a good idea to put an emergency clause on this so that we send them the letter before the decision is made.

General David Sprynczynatyk, Adjutant General for the state of North Dakota, appeared in support of this resolution. As explained very well earlier, the selection of the Grand Forks Air Force Base as the site for the new KC-46 tankers is really important, not only for northeast ND but the state as a whole. The significance of tying in the ND Air National Guard is simply that one of the criteria that is being used in the selection process is that there will be an associated relationship between the active component and a National Guard unit. Obviously, the closest National Guard unit is the 119th wing in Fargo. Given the fact that right now we may be without a flying mission in the not too distant future, having the opportunity to participate as part of the tanker mission out of Grand Forks and Fargo really is critical to our future. The emergency clause is very important as well. Within the next ten days, the Air Force will be making a site visit to Grand Forks. I'll be there for part of it, and the intent is that the decision will be announced by May, so the sooner a resolution of support from the legislature can arrive upon the secretary's desk, the better.

Steve Volk, State Commander of VFW, appeared in support. I am in charge of 13,000 members. I can remember years ago driving by that base when the tankers were there. This brings a lot of money into Grand Forks and a lot of money into the state.

Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:⁶

A concurrent resolution urging the United States Air Force to select the Grand Forks Air Force Base as the active duty main operating base for the new KC-46A refueling tanker mission.

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Minutes:

Chairman Dever: Opened the hearing on HCR 3012.

Representative Strinden, District 18: Testified as sponsor and in support of the bill.

Explained the bill.

(1:02)Chairman Dever: Do you know what a KC-46 A is?

Representative Strinden: Of course, it is a tanker. I wrote the resolution.

Chairman Dever: Do we have refuels in Grand Forks now?

Representative Strinden: We did.

(1:57) Maj. General Sprynczynatyk, Adjutant General: Testified in support of the resolution. It is a great opportunity for the Grand Forks Air Force base to have another viable mission to keep that base open into the future. Within the last couple of years the base did fly the KC-135 and that aircraft is about 50 years old and they are phasing them out of the system. The new aircraft, the KC-46, has the main body of Boeing 767. They will use that in the refueling mission to support other aircraft as they deploy around the world in

defense of our nation. Right now we need another mission at that base to ensure that the

base will continue to function and operate in NE North Dakota. We expect that this fall that

the Department of Defense and Congress will announce another round of BRAC (Base Realignment and Closure) and they will look very closely at every base and make decisions on their future. If we have missions such as the KC-46, that certainly will sustain the future operation of that base. We currently fly the global hawk out of that base. It is an unmanned aerial vehicle - that is an active duty mission, and we, the National Guard, fly a smaller predator vehicle in and out of that base for training purposes. Customs and border protection agency flies in and out of that base as well to provide reconnaissance along the northern border. If we are successful in landing the KC-46 as a mission at Grand Forks it would go a long was to assure the sustainability of that base. It also gives an opportunity for our North Dakota Air National Guard - that wherever it is, there will be an association with a reserve component unit. The nearest one is the 119th wing of the Air National Guard out of Fargo. We are very excited as a National Guard to potentially be part of that mission. This past summer, the Governor and myself co-signed a letter to the Chief of Staff of the Air Force and the Secretary of our Air Force indicating the willingness and the great interest on behalf of the state of North Dakota in associating with that mission. There are 4 bases in contention right now for the first location and so on the surface our chances are 1 in 4 and then one to the south of us will be picked as a training base so that makes it 1 in 3. The Air Force was at Grand Forks two weeks ago and did a great job of inspecting the facility and every indication was that they were pleased with what they saw in terms of infrastructure and the facilities that could be used for the KC-46.

(6:07)Chairman Dever: Is the KC-46 currently in use?

General Sprynczynatyk: It has been off the assembly line a couple of years as a tanker. The designation of the first location will be made on May 1st and it will not be until 2016 that the first KC-46 will be available to locate at Grand Forks hopefully. It is not in use yet. Chairman Dever: Does the sequester have any impact on this going forward?

General Sprynczynatyk: As of today no. I cannot guarantee that tomorrow. The fact is that we need a tanker to support our missions from the Air Force standpoint. The KC-135s are nearly 50 years old and there has been no indication that the sequestration will affect that.

Senator Nelson: Who builds them?

General Sprynczynatyk: It is a Boeing aircraft and they modify it for military purposes.

Even though it is a tanker aircraft, they can take the bladders out that hold fuel and they

can put the same seats in it as you have experienced in the C-130.

Tanker assessment nears at Grand Forks base

GRAND FORKS, N.D. — A federal survey team is to visit Grand Forks Air Force Base later this month to assess its potential to host an air refueling tanker mission.

The base is one of four being considered for the new active-duty KC-46a tanker mission. The others are in Oklahoma, Washington state and Kansas. The Air Force plans an announcement in the spring after on-site surveys.

Local officials plan to tout the Grand Forks base's many assets, including its previous history with flying tankers and its new mission with unmanned aircraft.
