Relating to distributors and manufacturers of games of chance.

Minutes:

Chairman K.Koppelman: Opened the hearing with testimony in support.

Rep. K. Karls: Introduced the bill.

Deb McDaniel, Office of Attorney General: We are sponsoring this bill today. We would require 50/50 manufacturers to be registered through the state so we can test their systems independently by a third party. The second part is to stamp raffle event boards & poker event boards to ensure the funds get to their charitable uses.

Rep. Mary Johnson: The handhelds that they already use at football games only make tickets.

Deb McDaniel: We have already had that manufacturer go through

Rep. Lois Delmore: There would then be an added cost to a manufacturer, is there a carryover from the bingo cards and 50/50?

Deb McDaniel: Yes they could also manufacture those games normally we charge a \$4,000 fee for manufacturers and we would be willing to go as low as \$500 licensing fee for 50/50 systems.

Rep. Lois Delmore: The bill looks like \$4000

Deb McDaniel: That is correct, and it was requested that we lower that amount & would require an amendment to this bill.

Rep. L. Klemin: Subsection 3 on page 2 this gaming stamp is to be fixed with paddle wheel ticket cards. How does that work with an electronic paddle wheel?

Deb McDaniel: It doesn't. We would need to find out the technology with these electronic wheels.

Rep. Mary Johnson: How are the mechanical wheels stamped?

Deb McDaniel: The wheels aren't stamped. There is a strip that has a stamp on it and that end of the strip is kept by the gaming organization and is tracked.

Rep. Lois Delmore: How much revenue is raised with the \$0.10 out of \$36,000? Do you know what those numbers are?

Deb McDaniel: I can get them real quick.

Proposed amendment 1

Chairman K. Koppelman: Rep. Karls handed out proposed amendment 1 and was asked to explain.

Rep. Karls: As you recall, there was quite a high license fee in the first part of this bill and a smaller one later on. Deb McDaniel brought this amendment forward from the gaming division and set the license fee at \$500 for a manufacture of raffle systems. I move to adopt this amendment.

Rep. Hawken: Seconded the motion.

Voice vote. Motion carries.

Chairman K. Koppelman: Essentially what the bill does is adds the 50/50 raffle systems to the current law.

Rep. Karls: When Deb McDaniel took over as head of the gaming division, she noticed that this wasn't covered in any of their code so they asked that it be put in and some license fees added.

Rep. K. Koppelman: This is not an expansion. This is something that is currently there. It is just a matter of it was overlooked in the code.

Rep. Hawken: Made a motion for a DO PASS AS AMENDED.

Rep. Maragos: Seconded the motion.

Rep. Wallman I can't remember if this includes raffles that would be fundraisers for athletic teams, etc.

Rep. Hawken: I think honestly there are about three places in the state where this would have an effect like the halftime at football games.

Rep. P. Anderson: I remember too. It is something like the team makers. I received a couple of emails that said they were fine with the \$500 50/50 raffles.

Rep. Maragos: Microphone not on.

Rep. L. Klemin: Discussed the roulette wheel and I think this is an expansion of gaming in ND. (Could not hear this speaker)

Rep. Karls: I believe it is for the manufacturer. The amendment covers the manufacturers' license.

Rep. L. Klemin: Then the party conducting the 50/50 raffle does not have to pay any licenses, at least not \$500?

Chairman K. Koppelman: I think that is correct. I am not sure though whether they need to apply for a permit license in order to conduct the raffle. I think there are some organizations that don't really conduct charitable gaming regularly, but they might want to do a raffle once a year.

Rep. M. Johnson: Did we remove that for 50/50 systems from line 7 and 8?

Chairman K. Koppelman: We didn't remove that because I think the intent is to add that. Maybe it does need to be.

Rep. M. Johnson: The manufacturer has to pay an annual license fee of \$4,000?

Chairman K. Koppelman: I think Rep. Johnson is right. If we leave the or 50/50 raffle system on line 7-8, the implication then is they have to pay the \$4,000.

The motion was withdrawn by Rep. Hawken and Rep. Maragos.

Rep. L. Klemin(?): I think the correct thing to do is to remove or 50/50 raffle systems from lines 7-8.

Chairman K. Koppelman: I do too. That is what Rep. Johnson had just recommended. I think, Rep. Maragos, what you are looking at is that on line 7 it talks about pull tabs, but on line 9 it talks about pull tab dispensing devices which I think are two different things. The intent of the amendment is to remove it from that bundle and to make it a \$500 license fee instead of the higher one.

Rep. L. Klemin: Also to further amend these to delete the overstrike over the word or on line 7.

Rep. P. Anderson: I thought the bill was to add a license fee for 50/50 for \$500.

Chairman K. Koppelman: It is. The issue is the amendment that we adopted overlooked the fact that the 50/50 raffle systems as mentioned on lines 7-8 and needs to be removed there in order to accomplish the intent of the amendment.

Rep. D. Larson: It looks like with some of these things, they have to pay annually. There are different annual fees depending on what it is, and just for the 50/50 they only want \$500?

Chairman K. Koppelman: Correct.

Rep. L. Klemin: Moved the amendment to remove or 50/50 raffle systems from lines 7-8 and to remove the overstrike on the word or in line 7.

Rep. M. Johnson: Seconded the motion.

Rep. Hawken: Microphone not on.

Chairman K. Koppelman: I think they will like \$500 better than \$1,000.

Rep. Kretschmar: It would seem to me if there is a manufacturer of pull tabs, bingo cards, bingo card marking devices, he pays \$4,000. If he also makes 55 raffle systems, he pays another \$500. We want this guy to pay \$4,500?

Chairman K. Koppelman: What we will do is suspend the discussion on 1231. The shape we are leaving it in is that the committee has amended the bill. We have the motion to further amend before us dealing with lines 7-8. We will seek some clarity.

Rep. Paur: Part of that amendment, page 2, line 6 after poker insert event. Poker event board is the way I read it. That is actually something?

Chairman K. Koppelman: Apparently so.

Rep. Karls: As I recall, doesn't this have something to do with UND and NDSU? These are large money generating events.

Rep. L. Klemin: There is another issue here. With HB 1230 we gave it a 7-6 do pass earlier today. On this bill the existing law requires on page 2, line 6, that this gaming stamp be applied to paddlewheel ticket cards. HB 1230 isn't necessarily going to have paddlewheel ticket cards if it uses this electronic paddlewheel. Deb McDaniel said this gaming stamp that is required by current law is an issue with the electronic paddlewheel. I hope the one doesn't pass anyway which will take care of this problem. If it does pass, there is an issue here with how you fix the gaming stamp to electronic tickets.

Rep. M. Johnson: I believe we discussed how that stamp applies in an electronic game. They are required in the electronic game to get the stamp, electronically produced.

Rep. L. Klemin: As I understood it from the testimony, they actually stamp all these paper tickets.

Rep. M. Johnson: You can electronically produce a stamp as well.

Chairman K. Koppelman: I have announced we are going to suspend the hearing.

Committee member (unidentified) I would like to give Rep. Karls what the university sent, what Ralph Englestad sent out. It is very similar to your language, but I think that is probably what the intent is.

Chairman K. Koppelman: That is fine, and we should make sure that Rep. Karls checks that with Deb McDaniel and perhaps legislative council just to insure that we are on the right page. Do check on the motion that is before us, whether they want it removed.

Ch. Hogue: We will open the hearing on HB 1231.

Rep. Karen Karls: Sponsor, support. This was brought to me on the request of the Attorney General's Gaming Division and deals with 50-50 raffle systems. There is also an amendment to add to it.

Ch. Hogue: Thank you. Further testimony in support.

Deb McDaniel, Director of Gaming Division, Office of Attorney General:
Support (see attached 1 and 2).

Ch. Hogue: What is a 50-50 raffle?

Deb McDaniel: Currently, NDSU and UND are using these systems as a substitute to the 50-50 tickets, the individual tickets that are handed out. It's a system that prints off the tickets automatically while they are purchasing the tickets from the organization. All of the tickets are printed; however, they are put in a barrel immediately and drawn out instead of having people run around with the little hand printed tickets, they have a device where they just punch in that the person is buying the tickets and it gives them a receipt and then the ticket is printed and put in a barrel for drawing. That's what this system does; it prints the tickets automatically instead of having the hard tickets on hand available right there.

Ch. Hogue: What does a 50-50 refer to?

Deb McDaniel: Depending on the players, they buy a ticket, 50% of the gross is given away in prizes and 50% is kept by the organization. That's where the name came from. They can give away less or more, but that is what the 50-50 comes from.

Ch. Hogue: So they can give away more than 50% or less than 50%; but it's always called the 50-50.

Deb McDaniel: It is usually 50-50 cut.

Sen. Nelson: Didn't we have a bill during the first half dealing with the universities that allowed these systems and that was all who could use the system.

Deb McDaniel: There is a 50-50 system, which is being tested right now; there are no administrative rules for them yet. It's being tested because it just prints the tickets to be drawn out of a barrel. There is a bill that's being introduced where they used a random numbered generator to decide the winner, instead of printing all the tickets and manually picking a ticket out. That bill is where the computer system would determine the winner of the game. This is just for the system itself that prints the tickets. We want to get them licensed before we start making administrative rules for just that system.

Ch. Hogue: We have one manufacturer of this system.

Deb McDaniel: Yes, currently.

Sen. Casper: In section 1 there, we're just saying a manufacturer of the raffle systems shall apply annually for license and pay a license fee of \$500.00. So the folks that are making these systems that the universities are using, they are going to have to pay that fee every year.

Deb McDaniel: Yes, correct.

Sen. Casper: But the company is paying that, not the school. I'm wondering, if we only have a couple of institutions using this, how often are they really selling them the system, and if they aren't making any money, because they sold one to the school, and then they have to pay a fee to the state of ND annually. There is a very limited market here.

Deb McDaniel: Correct. If you look in the statute, we require most manufacturers to pay a \$4,000 fee a year, so we reduced it to the \$500 and then the system also has computer hardware in it to get the payment from the player into the system. The system is rented from the manufacturers. The manufacturers are still going to be involved.

Ch. Hogue: Can you provide any revenue data like we got on the last bill, how big an enterprise this is, in terms of dollars.

Deb McDaniel: I don't have that with me. I can provide it to you.

Sen. Luick: Can Ms. McDaniel explain the amendments.

Deb McDaniel: The amendments deal with the rental of equipment. On page 2, line 2 is taking out "or 50-50 raffle systems that the distributor may purchase or acquire used pull tab dispensing device or 50-50 raffle system from a licensed organization". They don't purchase these systems; it's a rental from the manufacturer. That was a mistake on our part. It should not have been put on line 2. Page 2, line 6, this is where the raffle event board and poker event boards. There isn't a raffle event board or a poker event board. Our office thought that we would be able to better regulate the industry by putting on these gaming stamps for these boards. However, further discussion with the city auditors and gaming organizations, it would cause more of a hardship for the organizations to get a gaming stamp for every single raffle that they conducted. There are raffle boards and they can purchase it from a distributor and get a gaming stamp on it so that we're not concerned about raffle boards, just the raffle event board and the poker event board. Down on line 19, we want to insert gaming equipment because right now it says a licensed manufacturer may not refuse to sell pull tabs or paper BINGO cards. Licensed manufacturers sell all kinds of gaming equipment and parts and things to the organizations and if we don't insert "gaming equipment", licensed manufacturers may refuse to sell parts for other gaming equipment to licensed distributors and if a licensed distributor is no longer in business or has a hardship in obtaining these parts, other gaming licensed organizations cannot obtain the parts because the manufacturer aren't providing them.

Ch. Hogue: Thank you. Further testimony in support. Testimony in opposition. Neutral testimony. We will close the hearing.

Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee, my name is Deb McDaniel. I am the Director of the Gaming Division with the Office of Attorney General.

This bill, if passed, would require manufacturers of 50/50 raffle systems to be licensed through the state. With this requirement the state would be able to write administrative rules to ensure that the systems meet specifications to our standards and require testing of the systems by an independent testing laboratory.

This bill would also require licensed distributors to affix a North Dakota gaming stamp to raffle boards, raffle event and poke event boards provided to licensed organizations by distributors.

Recent input from licensed organizations revealed that there would be a hardship to these organizations and enforcement issues with the requirement to affix a North Dakota gaming stamp to raffle and poker event boards. Also review of the current statute showed a gap in the requirement that a licensed manufacturer may not refuse to sell certain gaming items to licensed distributors. The current language is too narrow and adding gaming equipment to the statute would cover this gap.

With the permission of the Chairman, we would like to submit amendments to House Bill 1231 to address these concerns.
