Chairman Laffen: Opened the hearing on HB 1346. We welcome Representative Matthew Ruby.

Representative M. Ruby: I think this is a simple bill, just adding the language vertical or horizontal. See attachment #1.

Chairman Laffen: There are a lot of custom made bikes and there is no room on some of the bikes because of big oversized tires, narrow fenders, etc. The plate then sticks out of the side of the bike, too, and is prone to get caught on things.

Representative M. Ruby: Wind sometimes will bend the horizontal plates where if it had been vertical it would have been fine.

Senator Campbell: Where is this coming from? I do agree it makes sense.

Representative M. Ruby: I felt it was just pointless. When I bought my bike I wanted it vertical and they told me I couldn't do it that way. So I did some checking and put in a bill allowing it vertically or horizontally.

Senator Rust: Did you contact the DOT about having issues with the people making the plates? Will there be an extra cost to them or have you talked to anyone at all?

Representative M. Ruby: I didn't talk to them about this but it would be the exact same plate, just turning it differently.

Senator Nelson: Is your license plate 12" off the ground? Would you have any problem combining these two bills, HB 1159 and HB 1346?

Representative M. Ruby: Yes, it would still be 12". I am not changing any regulations. No I would not have a problem with the two bills together.

Senator Clemens: One other thing we might want to consider when mounting licenses vertically are the flatbed smaller utility trailers. They have no place to mount a license except on a fender and then they mount them vertically because the plate would be sticking out otherwise. So it might make sense to add those trailers in the bill also.

Chairman Laffen: That would be an amendment if you would wish to do that and it would change the bill because right now this is just motorcycles. That would go to Conference Committee as they didn't hear that on the other side.

Senator Clemens: Is it something we should think about?

Representative M. Ruby: This was brought up on the House side, and if that is something you would want to do, it would clear it up for everyone, and I see no issue with this.

Chairman Laffen: Any other questions? None. Thank you. Any other testimony? Closed the hearing on HB 1346.

So I submitted the bill and upon gathering signatures I ran into my next possible issue; would there be a required changed to the way the 5 numbers are displayed vertically rather than just turning them on their side? I am not proposing a change based on what I heard from the highway patrolmen, however the DOT might have concerns.
