Rep. Corey Mock: I was wondering if Coach Thomas had some words to share with us. What different types and styles are available.

Coach Thomas: right now there are 2 main types of debate. One is public forum debate; these topics deal with current issues. The other side of the debate style is Lincoln/Douglas style, what ought to be in the world. More broad based things. Invites the committee to see an upcoming debate event.

Chairman- Mark S. Owens: Sat 28 at Shiloh. 8am to 2pm. Any other questions.

Rep. Rich S. Becker: those are 2 large high schools in the state. There are some home schooled students here today as well, my question is you have student from Bismarck and 2 to 3 high schools and Mandan High School, and you have additional people or whatever, what is a typical day for you like.

Coach Thomas: My day, I am not an educator and I am an HR. I work from 8am to 5pm, I have an hour for supper, and meet the kids over at legacy high school at 6:30pm, we practice up until 8 to 8:30pm 2 nights a week. I do that 2 days a week in Mandan, then we drive to Fargo to compete.

Rep. Rich S. Becker: I thought of another question. You need a marketing program; how do you recruit new students into the program.

Coach Thomas: Last year is the first year Shiloh had a debate team, and last year is the first year that legacy and Bismarck high school, and century had the opportunity to compete in debate as well. The kids did not have people that wanted to coach, but I stepped up to coach for those kids. As it goes on I think kids are going to join. You can ask any of the kids that spoke today and they will tell you how much it benefits them, also it is a very competitive activity. Some of the Fargo teams have a team of 30 to 40 kids.

Chairman- Mark S. Owens: any opposition to HCR 3001.

Rep. Corey Mock: I was tempted to be opposed to something that Representative Beadle was in favor of, through our debate pass, I am excited to see that there is no opposition to this.

Chairman-Mark S. Owens: any neutral testimony. Speech did not come along until college, and one of the biggest fears is public speaking. That was me through high school, but the skill was developed later in life. I want to thank the students today, and I do hope to return to this chamber today and see some of you kids work here in the future.

Joe Kolasky: I am the deputy director for the department of public instruction, I wanted to congratulate and commend those students for saying some words in front of authority figures. They gave good points, and answered some questions. Kids get in trouble most between 3pm and 6pm, and any type of after school activity promotes cognition, school achievement, and keeps them out of trouble. Commending testimony.





Good Morning Chairman Owens and members of the committee. For the record, my name is Thomas Beadle, State Representative from District 27 in Fargo.

I am happy to introduce this resolution today on behalf of the Speech and Debate teachers, coaches, students and alumni in North Dakota. As a former competitor and a former coach, I can speak to the value and positive impact that speech and debate activities can have on the participants. I know the impact that my involvement in forensics has had on my life, and I was fortunate to see that in my students that I coached as well.

Students who participate in Speech and Debate learn valuable life skills such as research and organization, writing, effective use of rhetoric and persuasion, and an appreciation for the performing arts. We are nearing the end of the debate season in North Dakota, with the state tournament taking place in two weeks. I still remember the first topic I ever debated; "Resolved: An oppressive Government is more desirable than no government." Good morning----

My name is Jake Thomas. I have been coaching high school debate for the past nine years in North Dakota. At the present moment I am the head debate coach for all of Bismarck and Mandan public schools. I am excited to be here this morning to show my support for this resolution.

Hubert Humphrey once said that "Freedom is hammered out on the anvil of discussion, dissent, and debate." And although my debaters may not be solving the world's problems in a real sense there is no doubt they are doing their part in forging the metal of freedom that Mr Humphrey discussed.

I am honored to be here this morning with three of my current debaters. These men are very good at what they do and I am beyond proud to say that I am their coach. I am excited for you to be able to hear their story and about how participating in high school debate has made a difference in their life.

Competing in high school debate is tough---really tough. Although we may not be running around a track or up and down a playing field there is real stamina involved in having to constantly be prepping for the next argument or finding the way to block our opponents attack. This activity requires an attention to detail that would be hard to find in any other activity or sport---with one slip up being able to cost you an entire 45 minutes' worth of debating.

There are numerous benefits to list for participating in speech and debate---and you will no doubt hear many today from my debaters. From my perspective as a coach, the one that sticks out the most to me is the character building that accompanies this great activity.

Having coached many students these past nine years I have seen how this activity changes them. I have seen kids who join the team absolutely terrified of speaking in public and at the end of their first season they are in the final round at the state tournament. I have seen how this activity forces you to win with character and humility. I like to think that as a coach my job is to make sure that I have good people saying things well. If I have a debater who wins many rounds but lacks character and humility I have failed in my job as a coach.

Good debaters do learn how to win with humility and lose gracefully. A good debater knows when he's been beat and handles it with class. They learn there is no such thing as the perfect case or an air tight argument. To be successful they must leave their ego at the door and shed all pretenses. They are forced to analyze issues from a perspective they may not be used to or even comfortable with. These things should be happening for every student in this state and it's why I am passionate about growing this activity here in North Dakota.

Being able to mold young people into effective speakers, researchers, and thinkers has truly been a blessing in my life. I am honored to be here today sharing this time with you and my debaters. I look forward to many more years of coaching and seeing this great activity flourish in our state.

The National Speech and Debate Association, formerly known as the National Forensics League, has been guiding the competition of Speech, Debate and Student Congress since 1925. This organization is supported by the National High School Activities Associations, and North Dakota has had schools competing in these activities for 90 years. Students from across the country, as well as from a few foreign nations, gather every year for the national tournament in June, where students compete for pride, glory, trophies, and scholarships to help further their education.

Students who participate in Speech and Debate learn valuable life skills such as research and organization, writing, effective use of rhetoric and persuasion, and an appreciation for the performing arts. We are nearing the end of the debate season in North Dakota, with the state tournament taking place in two weeks. I still remember the first topic I ever debated; "Resolved: An oppressive Government is more desirable than no government." And the last topic I had as a competitor, "Resolved: A democracy is best served by a strict separation of Church and State." Current topics include the US Federal government substantially increasing its economic and diplomatic engagement with the People's republic of China, whether Colleges should restrict constitutionally protected free speech, or whether the US should significantly increase its military spending to respond to international conflicts. Seriously, this is what I did on Fridays and Saturdays throughout school.

The North Dakota High School Activities association hosted the state tournament for student congress here at the capitol in November, with Richardton-Taylor taking home the state championship. The debate state tournament was held in Fargo the first weekend in February, with Fargo North winning first, and Fargo Davies claiming runner up. The national qualifiers from the Debate Invitational were Grace Ward and Austin Weigel from Shanley, and Emily Hao and Trae Larson from Fargo North representing our state in Public Forum Debate, and Laurel Schley from Shiloh Christian and Isaac Spanjer from Fargo North representing our state In Lincoln Douglas Debate. The State A Speech Tournament will be held at Jamestown High on April 22nd, and the State B Speech Tournament will be held at Mandan High on April 29th. The week of the State A tournament will also see the national qualifying tournament take place at the former Seven Seas hotel in Mandan.

While we may be a few days past March 3, I think it is still important that we continue pushing this resolution forward to send message that North Dakota supports the positive impact of Speech and Debate has on our students. Unfortunately, schools often struggle to maintain funding and support for these activities, and we have seen numbers ebb and flow over the years. Our continued support of these lessons is very important. For your consideration, I have also included a copy of the 2016 US Senate resolution honoring Speech and Debate Education day.
