

Chairman Poolman: Opened the hearing on SB 2104.

Dan Sipes, Interim State Chief Information Officer, ITD: See Attachment #1 for testimony in support of and to explain the bill.

(1:45) Chairman Poolman: Was there any reason for the change in the first place? Did something happen?

Dan Sipes: Last Biennium, we have the statewide longitudinal data system and as part of that we have job information that we exchanged in order to populate that. When the current bill was written it was inaccurately written – that job service wouldn't disclose rather than ITD would disclose. It is just cleaning up the language to accurately reflect what it should have said the first time.

Senator Marcellais: The ND Job Service office has been closed in Rolla. Did you pick up the computer equipment up there?

Dan Sipes: I think that I would defer that to Cheri Giesen.

Cheri Giesen: We have picked up the equipment and we had to go through the surplus supply process. I know there was some interest in having some of that equipment in the community. There is a formal process to get it through surplus property and then communities can then go to surplus property and pick it up.

Senator Marcellais: I know that the Turtle Mountain band of Chippewa tribe is interested in some of that equipment. I brought it to their attention that we do have a government to government transfer.

Cheri Giesen: It should be available at surplus property to do that government to government.

Chairman Poolman: Asked for additional testimony.

Cheri Giesen, Executive Director, Job Service ND: See Attachment #2 for testimony in support of the bill.

(5:00) Senator Bekkedahl: Are there not interagency agreements that could take care of these parameters vs. putting it into statute? Or does statute just back up the interagency agreements? We seem to put everything in code and wonder if we have to put everything in code.

Cheri Giesen: My understanding that this probably would have to have been in statute. It is ensuring that we would provide that data. It doesn't hurt.

Chairman Poolman: Asked for further testimony and there was none. Closed the hearing on SB 2104.

Senator Meyer: Moved a Do Pass.

Senator Marcellais: Seconded.
