Provides the Adjutant General \$11.0 million in borrowing authority and \$11.0 in spending authority for defraying expenses of law enforcement support for pipeline protest activity and to provide grants to a county for extraordinary costs related to pipeline protests.

Section 1 allows the Adjutant General BND borrowing up to \$8.0 million as well as appropriations to spend \$8.0 million. Section 2 allows BND borrowing up to \$3.0 million as well as spending authority to provide up to \$3.0 million in grants. Section 3 provides an emergency measure which allows the Adjutant General to borrow and expend \$11.0 million in the 2015-17 biennium, if necessary.

Section 2 also allows a county to receive reimbursement up to \$3.0 million for extraordinary costs related to pipeline protests.

**Chairman Holmberg** called the committee to order on SB 2174. Roll call was taken.  
**Senator Dever** was absent, all others present.

**Senator Rich Wardner, Senate Majority Leader, District 37, Dickinson, North Dakota.**  
Testified in favor of SB 2174. Amendment 17.0823.01001 – attached #1.

SB 2174 is an emergency bill to declare that we fund and borrow \$8M from the Bank of North Dakota to take care of the cost of the protests so far. We will do another bill later on when we know the exact numbers. Another question is why are borrowing or doing this? We want to pay the people that are over in the trenches. They need to be paid. The law enforcement and the emergency services people that are out there on the front lines need to be paid. Why are we borrowing instead of just paying it? Because we think that somebody else needs to step up to the plate and pay their portion – and we're basically talking about the federal government. We're not going to make a payment that is final until we've exhausted all avenues to make sure that the federal government will take care of it. It's on their land. That's where it's happening and I want you to know that all three of our congressional delegation are working on it. Our governor and people in charge are pressing on to make sure the federal government gets the message. This bill is to appropriate \$8M at this time to take care of the expenses that have occurred. This is on top of the \$17M, so we're looking at a total of \$25M that we've borrowed from the Bank of North Dakota to take care of the expenses down there. I'm introducing the amendment which would make sure that Morton County gets paid. The amendment provides an additional \$3M of borrowing and appropriation authority to the adjutant general to provide grants to a county that is experiencing an emergency related to the protest activities, that being Morton County. We'd like this bill voted on, completed and kicked out of committee today so we can have it on the floor tomorrow.



**Adjutant General Dohrmann:** Handed out DAPL Expenditures 8/19/2016 thru 1/15/2017 – Testimony Attached # 2.

**Senator Robinson:** On the list of where dollars are going, we have State Agencies for \$2.5M. Does that include the Highway Patrol or is that separate from this particular listing? Are they absorbing these costs?

**Sheila Peterson, OMB:** The various state agencies who have provided peace officers and equipment in support of this effort include the State Dept. of Health, Parks & Recreation, the Dept. of Transportation, Corrections, the Highway Patrol, Game & Fish, and the Office of Attorney General. They all have sworn peace officers and other assets that were utilized in these last few months and will continue to be.

**Senator Wanzek:** You talked about exhausting every possibility of someone else helping pay this, mainly the federal government. Is there an opportunity or chance that we could identify or find out who is funding these protesters, besides the federal government? Can we somehow access that money and making them pay for part of these bills?

**Senator Wardner:** I don't know what kind of an opportunity we have there. We definitely have people looking into that.

**Senator Joan Heckman, Senate Minority Leader, District 23:**

Testified in favor of SB 2174. Testimony Attached # 3.

There are a number of opportunities out there to access reimbursement. There is a document I received from Ms. Peterson on the total that is going to be appropriated today to State Departments and that's about \$6.5M out of this \$8M so they will become whole as of this moment and take care of that spending. Also want to have a document in front of you so you know where the money is going.

**Senator Robinson: Moved to approve amendment 17.0823.01001.**

**Senator Bowman: Seconded the motion.**

**No Discussion.**

It doesn't need to be amended into this particular bill, but there are other state agencies that have been providing assets. Those seven at some point, will need to have their appropriation levels increased in order to accept and expend the funds from the adjutant general. We have listed those agencies and have the dollar amounts that they would be looking at. We asked

them to estimate their cost through June 30. At the point that these dollar amounts are added in for appropriation authority, we're hoping that would get them to the end of the biennium. And it is a total of \$6,515,221 for the seven agencies collectively. The Highway Patrol is the largest and over half of it.

**Chairman Holmberg** said he will carry the bill. He closed the hearing on SB 2174.



### Minutes:

Chairman **Delzer**: Called the meeting to order

0:00-5:36 Senator **Wardner**: What this bill does is gives the emergency services, adjutant general the power to borrow 8 million dollars. The proceeds of that loan will be authorized for the appropriation to the adjutant general for the propose of defraying expenses of law enforcement support related to unlawful actives related to the construction of the Dakota Access Pipeline.

Also, we amended this over at the house and added another 3 million, that money would be borrowed by adjutant general for the purpose to grant money to the counties that has experienced an emergency related to the protest actives of the Dakota Access Pipeline.

This keeps us current, this keeps us paying the law enforcement to keep us safe. Is this all the money? No, you can expect another bill later in this session. If actives continue like they have lately, the meter is running and expenses are going up.

Chairman **Delzer**: This gets us current, it's up to 25 million now on the original one we had done 17 million add 8 to that it's 25 million, that covers everything for now. That other 3 million should cover the counties cost until June 30<sup>th</sup>, an estimated amount.

Senator **Wardner**: Everyone needs to know that we are at 25 million, we borrow as we go. We need to be ready to give them the right to borrow more money.

Chairman **Delzer**: Questions

Representative **J. Nelson**: What are the chances of getting assistance from federal after the changeover tomorrow.



Senator **Wardner**: I really can't answer that

**5:45 General Alan Dohrmann Adjutant General:**

We had been in contact with the current administration, the core of engineers, the department of justice, department of army and the department of interior; to be blunt we have gotten no indication of federal law enforcement support. Our assumption is with the next administration that we will have that support. We have met with the US Attorney for the District of North Dakota, we've met with all the federal representatives of law enforcement agencies within North Dakota, we started those discussions with the assumption that we will get assistance from the federal government soon with the next administration.

Representative **J. Nelson**: Specifically, what are you asking for in the terms of assistance?

**General Dohrmann**: We can't give too much detail, we would like support from Bureau of Indian Affairs, Indian Affairs Law enforcement, Federal Marshals, Custom and Borders Protection and mainly what we are asking them to restore real law in ungoverned territory within the United States of America. And to also increase the law enforcement presents throughout the reservation in Sioux county. So that there's not a base of operations where they can plan protest activities. We need to get that camp cleared and would like to do that before the flood waters hit that area. We really need help south of the Cannonball River.

Chairman **Delzer**: One question, reason we have a county that's not being paid back because it's happening in that county and that makes it their responsibility unless the legislature makes a different determination?

**General Dohrmann**: Correct, based on our interpretation, the policy for years has been that we don't reimburse counties for emergency response unless extraordinary circumstance. In the past we've done special appropriation for that purpose.
