Chairman Poolman: Opened the hearing on SB 2183.

Senator Sorvaag, District 45: See Attachment #1 for testimony to explain and in support of the bill.

(4:05) Senator Vedaa: Have you considered a contest to design the coin to create more excitement about the coin?

Senator Sorvaag: Everything is on the table. The bill is not written for it to be the responsibility of the Veteran's Administration to get it designed. I would hope they would use that as a possibility too. The appropriation for designing it might not be necessary and I put it in there for a matter of discussion. I think there are a lot of ways that things could be done for no cost. I left it for the VA to come up with a criteria and how they want to do it. I just wanted some dollar amount that would cap it out so that we would know what we are going for.

Senator Bekkedahl: Are you meaning one per decedent when you say one per family?

Senator Sorvaag: If they get a flag, they would get a coin.

Senator Bekkedahl: What about prior deceased? Would the family be able to apply for the coin even though it did not exist when they actually deceased?

Senator Sorvaag: That was never part of any discussion.

Senator Bekkedahl: Could it be?

Senator Sorvaag: It is something I thought about to, but in looking at dollars you have to decide where to stop and where to start. I never realized the numbers of veterans we have a year. If the committee would want to go back, you can but I don't know how far you go.

Senator Bekkedahl: Is this appropriation for this biennium or next or ongoing? Is this for an extended period of time at those rates of death?

Senator Sorvaag: My understanding is that going forward is that this would now be part of the VA budget. It would be a matter of dollars that are appropriated when they do their budget. There is no sunset clause so that would be negotiated on how many dollars it would be each biennium.

Senator Marcellais: If we get our flag from US government, can't we get the memorial coin from them too?

Senator Sorvaag: The intent would be that it would be a North Dakota coin to thank all veterans and guard members from the state of North Dakota and the idea was that the state would pay for it as a thank you.

(8:34) James Nelson, Amvets Post 9, Chaplain: Testified in support of the bill. See Attachment #2 for an example of coin pricing for a coin personally designed. (Passed around several "challenge" coins as suggestions/examples) I was shocked by the figures on the fiscal note. Once the initial coin is given, then subsequently family members could request one but they would be charged a nominal fee. I believe based on the charts that I provided you a lot could be taken away from the fiscal note on this bill. If you were to sell the additional coins for even \$5 then you would potentially be at a 100% increase. As a chaplain I go to a lot of funeral and I think it is a great idea that the state of North Dakota would give its respect to the veteran. It could eventually become self-sufficient. The proceeds from sale of the coins could offset the cost of future orders and once the coin is on file there are no additional set up charges etc. I think it is high on the estimate of cost.

(12:30) Chairman Poolman: When we pass this bill, we are going to pass this on to appropriations. Are you willing to go to them and explain this and I think they would find that very helpful?

James Nelson: I could do that.

Chairman Poolman: The more specific you could be in Appropriations the better. I had the opportunity to attend war college and as part of that I was given a coin and it was such a neat token and I think families will think this is a special touch.

(13:50) Lt. Colonel Davina French, North Dakota National Guard: Testified in a neutral position on the bill and for information. We have a little over 52,000 veterans and 22% of them are over the age of 75. Charging of \$5 for every coin after the initial coin does have potential to make its own pot of funding. I am a commander that lost 3 soldiers in combat and I have seen what family members do. They literally make shrines in their homes and it is for many different reasons but there is nothing quite like a military shrine in a house hold. When those soldiers are killed in action all of the commands that are attached to that soldier will

give a coin from their command and those family members usually have those proudly displayed and this coin would add to the pride of that family.

Chairman Poolman: Opened SB 2183 for committee discussion.

Senator Bekkedahl: See Attachment #1 for amendment proposed to the committee. (Walked through the amendment.) The amendment addresses the retroactive nature as well as who can purchase coins. Senator Sorvaag really just wants every family of a deceased veteran to get a coin provided by the state of North Dakota and if they want more he is fine with them purchasing them.

(6:45) Senator Bekkedahl: Moved Amendment 17.0306.03002.

Senator Vedaa: Seconded.

Chairman Poolman: Asked the committee for committee discussion.

Senator Vedaa: Just to clarify, if a father died in 1972 and a family member comes in for a coin, that family member will have to pay for that coin, correct?

Senator Bekkedahl: That is correct. The original sponsor said that they could get one coin at no cost but he did not address the fact that families of prior deceased might want a coin so we came up with the compromise that it would be available at cost for them.

Senator Marcellais: I think what we are looking at is the startup cost for the program and then after that the families will contribute to continue the program is what I am hearing.

Chairman Poolman: Correct. In my discussion with the veterans who were here, they think it will be even less than that and they are willing to testify in front of Appropriations to that.

Senator Sorvaag just said to get the policy right here in GVA and let Appropriations figure out what that number is going to be. He just wanted to make sure the cap was there in terms of what they could raise for that program.

Senator Marcellais: Being a tribal veteran service officer, I just hope that the funeral home keeps up on this. Right now I having problems with free headstones and grave markers. The families don't understand that is free from the federal government. I am trying to help the families that have not done that get the markers that they can have.

Chairman Poolman: It is something to consider in education for funeral home directors; making sure everyone is on the same page as to what is available to veterans.

Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

A BILL for an Act relating to the conferment of a veteran's commemorative memorial coin; to provide an appropriation to the department of veterans' affairs; and to provide for retroactive application.

V. Chairman Bowman: Called the Committee to order on SB 2183. All committee members were present except Senator Holmberg. Levi Kinnischtzke, Legislative Council and Lori Laschkewitsch, OMB were also present.

Senator Sorvaag: District 45 in Cass County, is a sponsor of the bill and provided testimony attached # 1 in support of this bill. This is about a memorial coin that would come from the state of ND to all veterans and all guard members at their funeral. It would be a gift from the state of ND. Some states have it. When we come to put a fiscal note together, there would actually be about 1600 eligible per year, 3200 per biennium. If you look at the fiscal note, Commissioner Wagen worked with me, we found coins for \$10 or \$2. But if this goes forward, we wanted something of value. I finally chose a coin for \$7 that comes out to be about \$30,000 or so. After some discussion, and seeing how some other things come in and the tightness of the budget, we come up with, that they would have to raise funds for part of this. They would have to buy 4000 in the year and the state would provide \$8500. They could not spend more than \$4000 for design. Let's use an example, if they get the coin for free, the state would pay the first \$8500. The VA would be in charge of designing, distribution, and the state would be liable for the first \$8500. The GVA committee also added in section 1, subsection 2, if people had a military member die before this, the family could purchase one. The state would only provide one per family. The one from Missouri is the example.

Senator Grabinger: The picture you gave us shows military funeral, but on the back it says it is from the president. Would our state have the same kind of language or would it say the state is recognizing this?

Senator Sorvaag: That would be up to them when they design it. I chose not to go there at all in the bill. The intent is it would be coming from the state of ND. That is why I think it is critical that some of the funds come from the state.

Senator Wanzek: So if the numbers aren't quite right, or if it happens to be one biennium when there are more military deaths, what would happen?

Senator Sorvaag: They would have to raise more money.

Senator Wanzek: I am sure someone would step up?

Senator Sorvaag: I would certainly hope so. Again the 4000 is based upon the fact they need about 3200. Presumably they would sell them for more than what they paid for. They would have to use their creativity during the biennium. Just trying to get a workable figure.

Senator Hogue: Are you aware what the success of fundraising is for the ND Veterans Cemetery Association? Are they behind us on providing any funds? Where is the private money coming from?

Senator Sorvaag: I would use the reference of the PDSD dogs. They do raise half the money for the dogs. The VA would have to raise that money for this bill. There are no directives for that.

Senator Dever: You mentioned the dollars for each. Is that the cost of the selling price? If we are going to allow them to sell them for a profit, is there a purpose for that profit, or could they use that for a fund raiser to provide other services?

Senator Sorvaag: That was our cost. If they would want to put more on there for selling, that is not addressed in the bill. It is not addressed on what they could add to a sale. I would think if they go through with this there might be some clarifications on generated funds.

Senator Dever: It seems to me the purpose of the coin is a good one, so they should be kept affordable.

Senator Sorvaag: The purpose for the coin is to give a free one to every family. The first is free. If they choose to purchase others they could purchase one. This was brought in by Senator Bekkedahl and he would like to have one because his father died within the last year. That is where this was initiated. The bill as I wrote It, will provide for only those who die from when it goes into effect. Do we want to keep it affordable where they can buy as many as they want? I will leave that part of the discussion. The purpose is one free from the state.

Senator Dever: My father passed away in 1988 and my mother got the flag. If each of my four brothers would have purchased a coin, the 25% profit would have paid for the coin that was given to my mother.

Senator Sorvaag: That would be correct but, that would be your choice.

Senator Kilzer: On the first page subsection 1, under section 1, I questioned whether the veteran qualifies if the veteran just met A, or B, or C, or the other possibility was if the veteran has to meet all three? Then it goes on to D. The veteran meets the threshold by being qualified under just one of those. Could I have a little explanation on the form?

Levi Kinnischtzke: I would have to confirm with the legal staff who drafted this amendment to the bill. My understanding it could be anyone of A, B, C, or D.

Senator Sorvaag: The wording was provided to me by the veterans' group. The direction from the legal staff said whoever gets a flag gets one of these. That was the direction given that whoever qualifies for a flag qualifies for this coin. I am presuming the language does state the directions.

Senator Kilzer: Would that have been better to state that under subsection 1 before you list A, B, or C, that it qualifies under anyone of the subsections?

Levi Kinnischtzke: I believe that the way it was written by the legal staff follows the Legislative Council drafting manual, so therefore to state exclusively that that item wouldn't be necessary. I believe the way it is written now to include the word "or" after letter C, I believe that serves the purpose that the bill wants.

Vice-Chairman Bowman: No other questions? Any further testimony on SB 2183?

Jim Nelson: ND AMVETS Chaplain: I speak in behalf of ND Coordinating Council consisting of the American Legion, Amvets, DAV, Vietnam Veterans of American, and the VFW in support of this bill. He has testimony #2. He is a member of the honor guard and serving as chaplain. The ability of other family members to purchase this coin is a wonderful thing for the family.

Vice Chairman Bowman: Any questions? There was no more testimony. The hearing was closed on SB 2183.

Chairman Kasper opened the hearing on SB 2183.

Senator Bekkedahl representing Senator Sorvaag. He is unable to be here because of a budget hearing. Attachment 1. (:01:56-:03:00)

Jim Nelson, the local AmVets Commander, appeared in support. Attachment 2. (:03:28-:06:10)

Chairman Kasper: Has there been an organization found that will produce the coins?

Jim Nelson: We have looked into that, and there are two or three would do what we want to do. Artwork is normally free. If this would be approved, we would follow the lead like the USS ND with opening it up to the state. We are looking at initially 4,000 coins. The purchase price would probably be in a \$2-\$3 per coin range. My guess we would sell it for \$5-\$7.

Chairman Kasper: Do you have a committee that would determine what coin would be selected?

Jim Nelson: I believe that working with the Department of Veterans' Affairs that would be developed. I would guess the National Guard and the veterans' service organizations would have representatives on that board.

Rep. Laning: I have a concern that we are going to continue to come up with paraphernalia and eventually cheapen the value of giving the American flag to the veteran's family. Has there been any discussion at all regarding that? Maybe we are trying to give too many things.

Jim Nelson: There has been no discussion that I am aware of. I would not see it personally as a degradation of what the American flag represents, because that represents the nation.

There are about 26 other states that have a funeral coin. They are very dignified. It is just a nice little thing for the state to say thank you.

Rep. Rohr: Can we see some from some other states. I did see an example on the handout.

Jim Nelson: There is a national coin that you can purchase that would accommodate the flag.

Rep. Steiner: How would it work technically? My father-in-law is buried at the Veterans' Cemetery. If I wanted to purchase those coins and heard about this program, who do I contact and write the check to and how does it work?

Jim Nelson: Those are things we are working out if this gets passed. I am guessing it would be the Veterans' Affairs and the National Guard, because the National Guard is the military honors group for the state. You would probably make the check to the Dept. of Veterans' Affairs, because I am guessing they would be the primary source.

Rep. P. Anderson: I would love to give my four grandchildren a coin and talk about my father being in a submarine in Guam, and they would love that story. I think these coins are a great idea.

Rep. C. Johnson: This looks very similar to what the military call the challenge coins. Is there a way to personalize these memorial coins?

Jim Nelson: Yes, there are companies that now make a personalized coin.

Chairman Kasper: I personally would like a coin for myself and sons. Have you thought about having a type of authenticity certificate naming the service person's name and when they served?

Jim Nelson: That hasn't been discussed, but that is an excellent idea.

Rep. Olson: The coin can be purchased by a family member of a deceased veteran. Say a veteran lived in another state and died in another state, and that person moves here later in life. Would they be able to purchase a coin from the state of North Dakota commemorating an individual who never lived here?

Jim Nelson: The intent is ND, because it is ND thanking the family for their loved one's service. They would have to apply to their particular state if that state has one.

Rep. Olson: It doesn't look like there is anything in the language that would limit it?

Jim Nelson: Perhaps an amendment should be put on that it is for North Dakota people only.

Lt. Col. Davina French, ND National Guard, appeared in support. We are dealing with state institutes, both ND Veterans' Affairs and the ND National Guard, and we have federal funds involved through us. There is going to be an official way we have to do it based on

funding both through state if you fund this and the federal funds. The funds can't cross over. You can be guaranteed there will be a process to this. By law we have to number the coins and keep track of who gets those coins. There is a process you can follow to request a national coin if your state doesn't have one. There is something about when a soldier dies. I have seen every family member have a place in their house that is memorializing them. I can tell you that coin that they would receive would go in a special place in their home, because there is something about service to country that our citizens really respect.

Rep. Rohr: You pay your fee to get the headstone, and you get the flag. Is the coin automatically provided to the family for free?

Lt. Col. French: There will always be one coin that goes to the family for be free. Then you will have the option of how you apply for additional coins.

Rep. Rohr: Does every family that has a member out there going to be entitled to a free coin retroactively?

Lt. Col. French: I do not have an answer for that at this time. I didn't read it.

Chairman Kasper: We certainly want to be sure that the bill does not require if it is not the intent to be retroactive.

Rep. Rohr: Being retroactive now, would that get them one free coin? Then information should go out to the family members, and we should have that option to purchase one then since we have somebody out there.

Lt. Col. French: I would agree with you for the process. We have 64,000 veterans currently in the state.

Rep. Rohr: How many do we have at our veterans' cemetery?

Pam Helbling Schafer, Director of the ND Veterans' Cemetery, appeared. Currently, we have over 7,500 burials at the veterans' cemetery. I don't want to give you a wrong number as opposed to spouses, dependents versus the veterans. I certainly can get back to you with that information.

Chairman Kasper: I have one clarification on my comment about the certificate. I didn't mean it to be authenticity. I meant it to be to honor that person.

Blake Crosby, Bismarck citizen, appeared in support. He talked about having a favorite relative who served in World War II and purchasing a coin for that relative's spouse and could see her proudly displaying this coin in her home.

Chairman Kasper closed the hearing. I would like to have Megan just verify with Legislative Council that this would be retroactive.

Rep. Rohr: Section 3 says retroactive application.

Chairman Kasper: He read it. It is retroactive.

Rep. Laning: I am not opposed to that. I think we are going to establish a date when this takes place and any retroactivity will probably be at the cost of the family.

Rep. Olson: The retroactivity is Subsection 2 of Section 1. It looks like the only way the retroactivity enables you to get a coin is by purchasing the coin. That dovetails into my question of how is this limited to North Dakota? It appears that getting a coin occurs during military funeral honors which must be occurring I am assuming in the state. That limits it to North Dakota. We may want to figure out whether we want the purchasing of a coin to be limited only to a member who had funeral honors in ND.

Rep. B. Koppelman: Rep. Olson brings up a good point. There are many military veterans that may be buried in a national cemetery. Ft. Snelling in St. Paul, MN is a good example where some of the military veterans that served here, passed away here, or etc., were buried there. Would they still be eligible?

Chairman Kasper: We are going to hold this bill to try to come up with some answers. A subcommittee of Rep. Laning, Chair, Rep. Steiner, and Rep. Olson was formed.

Rep. Dockter: It is stated too they don't have a problem really raising the money, so by putting this in, they would get the funding privately. I really support the program with no funding for this biennium.

Rep. B. Koppelman: I don't think this is the time to lower the amount just so we can bypass the appropriations committee. I am going to resist the amendment to the amendment.

Rep. Rohr: It is going to be tough, but we heard about the charitable thing yesterday. They can submit an application.

Rep. Olson: We have done without a coin forever. Not every other state has anything like this. I don't think this is an emergency that this start right now and get going on it. They were anticipating raising over \$25,000. I think it is a great idea to give them the authority here. They have the fund. They have the continuing appropriation, and they have the continuing revenue from the sale of the coin to make it a self-sufficient program. Taking the public money out of it makes it something that nobody can argue with, and that is the beautiful thing about it.

Rep. Schneider: This is for our heroes who don't ask for very much. I would like some of those older veterans be able to see the design as soon as possible.

Rep. Dockter: Since it is for the veterans, there will be some ad agency design that I bet will do it for free.

Chairman Kasper: Another possibility could be to have a design competition.

Rep. Olson: I designed coins in the past for my firm. I plan on giving some of my own money to this, and I am going to contact the department to give them some advice, because I know some really good sculptors that can design the 3d rendering and make beautiful dyes for striking the coins.

Rep. P. Anderson: I will withdraw my motion.

Rep. Schneider: I will withdraw my second.

Rep. Steiner: Is it just ND vets?(Difficult to hear)

Rep. Laning: Anyone can buy a coin. When a vet dies, they have to request the support of the legion or somebody to get the flag. It is not automatic. So at the same time the vets' groups would be notified, and they can give the family a coin if they asked for a flag as well.

Chairman Kasper: If they are a ND citizen, they get it free.

Rep. Laning: Yes. If somebody dies out of state, they still have to notify someone. The vets' organizations do not have the responsibility to watch every obituary. They will be notified if the family then wants a coin. There is one free coin for the family.

Rep. Steiner: All buried veterans across the country?

Rep. Laning: It is going in effect August 1.

Rep. Steiner: Moving forward? Buried in Ohio, you get a free coin?

Rep. Olson: I think the intent of the bill was to provide a free coin to those being buried honors within the state of North Dakota. However, if they are buried outside of the state of ND, we are making them available for purchase of a coin. We wanted to make it clear and put it in our amendment that is for a North Dakota veteran.

Rep. Steiner: If they don't have the money to do the free coin, then they have the option to say no, we haven't raised the money. We don't have the money.

Rep. Olson: Yes. That would be contingent, of course, on them having raised enough money and produced enough of the coins ahead of time to give them away.

Voice vote again on Rep. Laning's proposed amendment. Motion carried.

Rep. Steiner: I know what the intent of the committee, but that is not what the bill says. If they can't raise the money, I don't want them to feel like they have to give away free coins when they don't have the money. It says they shall do this. Maybe you want to change shall to may so they have some flexibility.

Rep. Olson: However, that same problem exists without this amendment, because we were only going to appropriate to them \$8,500 of which \$4,000 would have been spent on the design of the coin. They estimated the cost of the coin as being \$7 each. If you have \$4,500 left, dividing that by 7 provides for 642 coins. You want to buy as many coins as you can in a single batch, because you are going to significantly reduce the cost.

Rep. B. Koppelman: Senator Sorvaag's testimony said the fiscal note reflects the need for designing and requires an initial purchase of 4,000 coins. You take 4,000 x \$7. You need \$28,000 plus the \$4,000 for design.

Chairman Kasper: The bill does not require that now.

Rep. B. Koppelman: Senator Sorvaag's testimony is suggesting they are not going to get minted unless they can buy 4,000.

Rep. Olson: Prior to the amendment, in Section 2, Line 9, Page 2, it states providing funding for at least 4,000 commemorative memorial coins. If you take the \$4,500 from the \$8,500, add it to the \$25,500, you have \$30,000 and dividing that by 4,000 is \$7.50 per coin. They were required to purchase at least 4,000 coins upon raising the \$25,500. What we are saying now is purchase however many coins you want, at any time you want, whenever you raise whatever amount of money you deem to be necessary.

Rep. Dockter: That basically was a number that he came up with that are eligible. I think they would be fine.

Senator Bekkedahl: Opened the conference committee on SB 2183. Asked for the House to give an explanation on the changes.

Representative Laning: I am looking at the 4003 version. All we did was remove the appropriation section and added the sub-paragraph 4 above that. The thinking was rather than start an appropriation that came out of general fund or anything, since the veteran's organizations were already looking at raising \$25,000 themselves we just thought we should allow them to raise the entire amount. They can manage it themselves and not have to worry about appropriations from the state. It did need to have a fund set up more or less. We had a little bit of an argument among ourselves on the appropriations part, but we settled on the sub-paragraph 4 that says "the department may expend any gifts, grants or donations received for the creation and conferment of commemorative memorial coins. I had discussions with Jim Nelson of the coordinating council, and he was ok with everything. We left the amendments the Senate put on with the retroactive applications etc.

Representative Anderson: I was the one that thought we should leave in the \$4000 for the design of the coin, but that did not go anywhere. Other than that, I was fine with taking the rest of the appropriation out.

Senator Bekkedahl: From the Senate perspective, the intent of the sponsor of the bill was obviously to get the coin out there as a commemorative. It is based on other state programs that are out there where they give a coin. The sponsor was pretty adamant about wanting the state of North Dakota to put some money in as a display of gratitude for what the veteran did upon their final act; which was their burial. Removing the appropriation means that it probably could still occur, but there will not be any true gratitude from the state of North Dakota without some appropriation. I think he was willing to let us work on the amount of the

appropriation and the language that specifies the design. Maybe do the design at no cost. I think we are all going to the same place, it is just how we get there and how do we work in the appropriation.

Just the passage of the bill itself represents a significant investment on behalf of the state outside of just appropriated dollars. I do not think that the state did not put anything in just because we do not have an appropriation.

Representative Laning: We did have discussions on the collection mechanism to some degree and we felt that the veterans are very heavily supported in North Dakota and that the funds would not be difficult to raise. In fact, we had some volunteering from our committee members that would even like to kick in on something like that as well. There were a few of us interested in the retroactive aspect that the Senate added on there as well. We did think there was importance in this being a self-supporting thing from the veteran's in North Dakota as well. They need to have ownership in the program, and it is something that they can be proud of as well.

Senator Bekkedahl: What I would like to do is bring the committee discussion to the prime sponsor and the Senate would be happy to bring back any recommendations from that discussion to the House. (The Representative agreed to that.) I am happy that you agree to the additional language about the deceased veteran's family being able to purchase a coin. I asked for that to be in there because I would like to have one for my father who just passed away.

Representative Laning: Our understanding is that there is only one free coin to be given at the funeral from the state of North Dakota and any others will be available to them, but at their cost.

Senator Bekkedahl: I am glad we agree on that one. Closed the conference committee on SB 2183.

They already have the ability, if they want, to take the interest that is gained out of the fund and spend it however they choose. We, as a legislature, do not have the authority to tell them how to spend those funds. If they want, that ability is already there for them to spend out of that fund for these coins. I do not think the amendment can fly the way that it is since it is not within our power. I talked to Jim Nelson who is the veteran who introduced the bill. His comment was, "I see the coin bill is back in committee. Could you discuss the issues that are causing the problem? Since there is no longer a fiscal note, I do not understand." I sent him back a note and let him know that the Senate had not concurred. I asked if I could still use his support for the amendment that we put on, and his response was that they were solidly behind the coin state money or not. He represented the five veteran's groups within the state of North Dakota.

They want the bill and we do too. The the appropriation seems to be the hang up. We would prefer to stay where the last amendment in the House was.

Chairman Bekkedahl: I appreciate you for the conversation on this earlier and digging into it. I would bring to the committee's attention. My research also talks about Article 10, Section 25 of the North Dakota state Constitution. (Reads from the section.) I would be in agreement with your interpretation that it is really up to them. I think what we are attempting to do here is to maybe have some language that could come out of the committee that suggests that we would look to them to use some of this at their discretion. It may not be necessary, but if we can have some time to discuss that I would appreciate it.

Representative Anderson: There is over \$6 million in the fund. It seems to me that is a good alternative to suggest that they use some of that.

Representative Laning: They cannot spend the principle either. The entire fund is set up and they live off of the gain in this fund.

Chairman Bekkedahl: From the state treasurer's website, as of March 1st, 2017, the value was just slightly under \$6 million. In the 2013-2015 biennium, there was \$952,000 in total earnings and expenditures of approximately \$273,000; \$67,000 went back to the principle. There has been activity in the fund.







Chairman Kasper and Members of the House GVA Committee,

SB2183 involves the State of ND providing a Commemorative memorial coin to the families of all Veterans and National Guard members at their funerals. This medallion would be presented to the same eligible family member

that receives the folded flag. There are other states that present this gift and I have attached a sheet with the example of the memorial coin given by the state of Missouri.

This memorial coin would be given as a recognition of their service to the nation and the State of North Dakota.

This gift would simply be a thank you, not only to the service members, but also the families for their service.

There would be about 1600 eligible recipients per year for this memorial coin. The fiscal note reflects the need for designing and requires an initial purchase of 4000 coins. We allotted \$4,000 for design and estimated \$7 for each coin. These dollar numbers could be high, but was used as a starting point. I feel that if this is something we go forward with, it should be done right with a special medallion that families would be proud to pass down for generations.

The appropriation was based on the above numbers and because of the tight budget felt that if this goes forward, costs over \$8,500 should be raised privately.

Subsection 2 of section 1 was added by the Senate GVA Committee, that would allow family members to purchase coins.


