Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 41-09-87 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the requirement of a social security number or internal revenue service taxpayer identification number on uniform commercial code and secured transaction records

Secretary Jaeger: The intent is that the filings filed with the SOS office, the real estate of the collateral for UCC isn't filed with the SOS office. That's what the effect language does, removes any of the filings with the recorder's office.

Uniform Commercial Code (UCC), Central Notice, agricultural statutory liens and notices, miscellaneous statutory liens, and state and federal tax liens are filed online with the Secretary of State's office. According to subsection 2 of section 41-09-87 of the N.D.C.C., these filings require the inclusion of either the Social Security Number (SSN) or Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN) of the debtor in order to accept the filing.

When the collateral for a UCC filing is real estate, that portion of the filing is recorded separately with the County Recorder's office of the county in which the property is located and it does not require nor would it be wise in open public record to the include either the SSN or TIN of the debtor.

On page 2, lines 21 and 22 amends subdivision h of subsection 2 of section 41-09-87 of the N.D.C.C to clarify that only those lien filings that are filed online with the Secretary of State's office have the requirement for the inclusion of the SSN or TIN in order to be accepted.

As a result, this text effectively excludes that requirement from the real estate filings, which are associated with a UCC document, but that are filed direct with the County Recorder.

On line 2, where the bill is described, there is a typo. It should read "number or internal" instead of "number of internal".

However, when the collateral for a UCC filing is real estate, that portion of the filing is recorded separately with the County Recorder's office in the county where the property is located. That portion of the filing does not require nor would it be wise in open public record to include either the SSN or TIN of the debtor.

Therefore, on page 2, lines 21 and 22 amends subdivision h of subsection 2 of section 41-09-87 of the Century Code to clarify that only those lien filings that are filed online with the Secretary of State's office have the requirement for the inclusion of the SSN or TIN in order to be accepted.

As a result, the amended text effectively excludes that requirement from the real estate filings, which are associated with a UCC document, but that are filed direct with the County Recorder.

In the context of the entire reading of subsection 2, it would read:

(page 1, line 8) "2. Filing does not occur with respect to a record that a filing office refuses to accept because:"

(page 2, line 21) "h. In the case of filings entered in the secretary of state's online filing system, the record does not contain the social security number or the internal revenue service taxpayer identification number of the debtor."
