**Rep. Pyle** appeared in support of the bill. HB 1316 updates century code verbiage to reflect the transfer and maintenance of veterans' records. This is a cleanup bill.

Rep. Rohr: Could you define mental hygiene on Page 2?

**Rep. Pyle:** I will defer the question to Lonnie Wangen.

**Lonnie Wangen, Commissioner of Veterans' Affairs,** appeared in support. The intention behind this bill stems from basically housekeeping to update verbiage. There were a couple of concerns that prompted it. In the past ND veterans have received discharge papers of all military members as they left the military. We have slowly processed out of having a paper copy and went to electronic digital copies which saves us a lot of storage. He pointed out some clarifications on Page 3, Line 29, and Page 1, 7-10. I am not sure about the hygiene part. This was reviewed by the attorney general's office and Part 6 was added when HIPPA became law.

**Chairman Kasper:** He asked Mr. Wangen to provide a sample of the DD214. He also asked the law intern to see if he could find the information about mental hygiene on Page 2. Attachments 1 and 2.

Jim Nelson, ND Veterans' Legislative Council, appeared in support.

**Rep. Louser**: If this was HIPPA it references a state department, not the state. If there is one, they are given authority to provide information and medical records. I do not think it references our state as having that agency.

Chairman Kasper: We will have the law intern find out. He closed the hearing.

We go to critters and look at all the discharges from N.D. That information is on an Excel spread sheet. We can go to DOD and down load the paper copy. This creates an issue with Code to update. L.C. update the words. We feel that the documents need to be protected. So that was updated. On page 3, lines 29-31, was the discharge paper updates. We added the veterans' dependents because we serve the, also. (4.47) Any questions?

**Sen. Richard Marcellais**: Does the veteran still get a hard copy to register at their local court house.

**Lonnie**: Yes, and no. When the veteran gets out they get electronic. Some will get a disc and others a user name and password. You can go down load all your military records. (5.25) That includes the DD214. They are relying heavily on the electronic information.


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#### [8:20 2019/18/1 AM] Ness, Claire J.:

That phrase refers to any state's (not just ND's) department of mental hygiene - or their equivalent of DHS. Mental hygiene is an outdated term, but it might be used in a federal law on which this was based. The attorney for the Department of Veterans Affairs worked on this with our office, and this issue did not come up. If the committee wants to use a more modern term, it would probably be ok., but I don't know what the alternative terms would be. Not every state has a DHS and not every DHS would be tasked with this.
