Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

Relating to leave for state employee volunteers

Minutes:

Chairman Kasper opened the hearing on HB 1354.

Rep. Dick Anderson appeared in support. I was approached by a local ambulance squad that is shorthanded with volunteers. They have three members in the state office that they would like to respond to calls if it is okay with whoever is in charge of the state agency.

Rep. B. Koppelman: Would this then be paid leave?

Rep. D. Anderson: We didn't put that in there, but that is a concern.

Rep. B. Koppelman: Could this have some unintended consequences throughout the state in areas that are much different than what you are suggesting?

Rep. D. Anderson: In rural areas you probably only have seven or eight calls a year. If it is a volunteer service in a larger town, it would probably affect them more. In these small towns if they can't get these people out of these agencies next door to the ambulance, down the road they are going to have trouble keeping their ambulance running.

Rep. P. Anderson: How long does it take to go from Towner to the hospital?

Rep. D. Anderson: Most rural calls from Towner are probably 30 minutes in and 30 minutes out.

Rep. Rohr: Are these people already on call?

Rep. D. Anderson: They probably have two or three people that might be on call, but they might not be located near the ambulance. The majority of the time if you are there, you just respond. If there are enough people there, then the others leave.

Rep. Rohr: Are they getting any resistance from their bosses?

Rep. D. Anderson: I don't think they are. If they are busy, they can't leave. They probably have been doing it already to some degree, but I think they were worried about legal consequences.

Chairman Kasper closed the hearing.

Rep. Laning made a motion for an amendment to put "paid" in front of leave on Line 15.

Rep. Schauer seconded the motion.

Rep. B. Koppelman: I think the bill sponsor was concerned about whether state policy will pay people who are volunteers to serve on those emergency services, so I am going to resist the amendment.

Chairman Kasper: I wouldn't have read it that way. These people respond for public safety and docking them pay could be a reason they don't want to respond. We need responders. I would support the motion.

Rep. B. Koppelman: Do we employ that large percentage of people in small towns?

Chairman Kasper: I can't answer that. The fact is there are state employees around the state that may volunteer.

Vice Chair Steiner: I am going to resist too, because it is too wide open for my comfort.

Voice vote was taken to adopt amendment, but indecisive. A roll call vote was taken. 7-6, 1 absent.

Rep. Schauer made a motion for a DO PASS AS AMENDED.

Rep. P. Anderson seconded the motion.

A roll call vote was taken. 9-4, 1 absent.

Rep. C. Johnson will carry the bill.

Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

Relating to leave for state employee volunteers.

Minutes:

Chairman Davison called the hearing to order. Attendance was taken and all were present. Open the hearing on HB1354.

Rep. Dick Anderson, Dist. 6, Bottineau: I am here to introduce this bill. I had a request from ambulance services in my district. It allows the firemen and medical services if their supervisor OK's it. In small towns, we struggle to find people to volunteer for ambulances and firemen. We need personnel to respond to calls. (2.56)

Chairman Davison: I understand that it is a paid leave of absence. (3.31)

Sen. Richard Marcellais: We have what is called community services in our area. They allow so much time for just what Rep. Anderson is talking about. (3.43)

Rep. Anderson. We have three ambulance services in our area. The other ones in areas close to us had to shut down because they could not get volunteers. Response time in a small town is pretty critical. (4.06)

Chairman Davison: The bill does say 'may'. If they don't want to allow a paid leave that is their choice.

Chairman Davison: Any more in support? Agency? Against? Hearing is closed.

Sen. Shawn Vedaa: There is good representation from Senate and House on this bill.

Chairman Davison: What are the committee wishes?

Sen. Richard Marcellais: I move a DO PASS. **Sen. Shawn Vedaa:** I second.

Chairman Davison: Roll: YES--7 NO- 0 -0-a.b. PASSED. Sen Marcellais will carry.
