HB 1191 - Reporting expenditures about candidates by multicandidate committees RE:

This bill attempts to place new disclosure requirements applying only to multicandidate committees. When a multicandidate committee makes an expenditure in support of or opposition to a candidate, the committee must disclose the expenditure on the next campaign disclosure statement submitted by the committee. As part of that disclosure, the multicandidate committee must disclose:

- 1. The expenditure category (e.g., Advertising and others found in NDCC § 16.1-08.1-01(8))
- 2. The amount of the expenditure
- 3. The name of the candidate the expenditure supports or opposes; and
- 4. The support or opposition stance.

During the 2020 election year, there were 548 different filers. Of those filers, 33 were multicandidate committees. In 2021, there are 27 multicandidate committees. On the second page of my testimony, I have provided the names and locations of the multicandidate committees registered so far in 2021 that would be impacted by this bill. As you will see, multicandidate committees are used by both political parties.

Our office was not asked to submit a fiscal note on this bill, but it will require a modification to the system so that multicandidate committees are able to disclose expenditures made during the calendar dates covered by the disclosure statement. Our office estimates that the cost of the enhancement to our system would cost between \$10,000 and \$20,000.

If the Committee members decide to give this bill a do pass, I would ask that the Committee also recommend that the Secretary of State be appropriated such funds as would be necessary to pay for this
