Good morning Chairwoman Larson and members of the Judiciary Committee. I am Eric Plummer and I am the Chief of Police for the University of North Dakota. Today I will be speaking in regards to Senate Bill 2168.

This legislation seeks to provide a remedy for issues which we have experienced along streets that border University of North Dakota property. For example, if one of our officers conducts a traffic stop for a law violation on University Ave at North 42nd Street, which is bordered on three sides by UND property, and the person simply turns into the Loaf & Jug parking lot, our officers have no authority to conduct an investigation into a crime which may arise out of that lawful stop (i.e., Driving Under the Influence, Assault, Drugs). There are similar issues with the other streets which border campus and are defined as our jurisdictional boundaries within Century Code.

These issues go beyond just traffic stops, but also violent crimes which may occur at these same locations across the street from UND property. An example of this would be at the same location, if the convenience store was robbed we would have no legal authority to act in response to the commission of this crime even though our officers are in the immediate area.

This legislation does not seek to expand the current jurisdiction of University Police Department, but it is to provide for a buffer to the current identified jurisdiction to address these concerns. This change would mirror the jurisdictional buffer provided to city police departments (1.5 miles from city limits) and county sheriff's offices (1,500 feet from county lines). These buffers were enacted to solve similar problems which were experienced by those agencies.

This legislation also seeks to change the term "hot pursuit" to the term "fresh pursuit," which is defined in N.D.C.C. 29-06-07 and often found within applicable case law regarding jurisdiction (i.e., United States v. Benitez, No. 06-3763 (8th Cir. 2008)). This would provide consistency within the established law.

Chairwoman Larson & Members of the Committee,

I would like to say thank you for the opportunity to provide the committee with testimony regarding Senate Bill 2168. I come before you as a member of the Grand Forks City Council representing the wonderful citizens of Ward 1, which also encompasses a large portion of the University of North Dakota campus. I would also like to inform you that I do work full time as the Investigations Commander for the University of North Dakota Police Department but am speaking on behalf of my role as a council member.

As an elected official who happens to work in law enforcement, I often see how the policies and laws that we put in place have an impact on the communities we represent. I often ask myself is this policy good for the community and in this particular case will it have an impact on making the community safer.

I truly believe that Senate Bill 2168 does both by addressing concerns from recent court decisions regarding impaired drivers (and other type of crimes) that happen to turn a few feet outside the outlined jurisdiction. This bill also addresses any safety concerns that university and community members may have on property that happens to be right next door to the university campus. Contrary to what some may say, this bill doesn't expand jurisdiction for UND Police Officers it only affords them the ability to enhance the safety of students and community members near the University of North Dakota.

I would like to provide you with an example of how UND Police Officers must handle situations that might be as little as 2 feet outside of the boundaries set forth. Loaf and Jug Gas station is located at the corner of University and North 42nd Street. Currently the UND Police Department has the authority to enforce state law on property located at 3 of the 4 corners of that intersection. In September of 2019, two masked men entered the Loaf and Jug Gas station, that is often frequented by UND students, and robbed the store at gun point. Officers from the UND Police Department were the first to arrive on scene due to the close proximity to the UND campus. In this situation, Officers from the UND Police Department must contact Grand Forks Central Dispatch to ask if the Grand Forks Police Department would like to request mutual aid for them to assist. Grand Forks Central Dispatchers then would contact the on duty Grand Forks Police Department Sergeant and inform him of the situation. The Grand Forks Police Department Sergeant would then say yes or no for the mutual aid request. At that point the dispatcher would then inform UND Police Officers of the decision. This process could take anywhere from 30 seconds to a minute and a half or more all while leaving a victim waiting on law enforcement officers that could be seconds away ready to act. Officers acting without the authority could have significant liability concerns.

This is just one example of how a small change to current law could have a big impact on the safety and well-being of the UND and Grand Forks Communities. I appreciate your time regarding this bill and would stand for any questions the committee may have.

For the record my name is Mike Borr, Director of University Police and Safety Office at North Dakota State University. I am writing today in opposition of the jurisdictional changes identified in Senate Bill 2168.

North Dakota State University has a number of concerns and questions with the bill before you today as currently written containing the suggested expansion of jurisdictional areas for our campus by establishing a 1500 foot expanded perimeter to current jurisdiction. They are as follows:

The jurisdiction extents which were established previously during the 65th Legislative Assembly are ideal for our law enforcement purposes and providing service and support for our campus community. We are not in support of changing this boundary.

The current jurisdiction provides a clear delineation of the boundaries to patrol jurisdiction. This clarity dissolves when a stipulation of 1500 feet beyond a specific geographic limit is made.

An extended boundary to our jurisdiction would add a number of additional bars, restaurants and other commercial establishments as well as significant residential areas within the city of Fargo. This is particularly the case for our downtown academic buildings.

We have a good working relationship with the other local law enforcement agencies and don't wish to jeopardize those relationships.

We feel our students are best served by the current jurisdictional boundaries. We see no substantial benefit to expanding it further.





Dear Chairman Klemin and Members of the House Judiciary Committee,

I am writing today in support of SB 2168. SB 2168 serves to correct and clarify problems we have encountered with the current law.

SB 2168 replaces the term "hot pursuit" with the term "fresh pursuit." These terms have very distinct definitions under the law, which impacts the circumstances under which a law enforcement officer may complete a traffic stop if the suspect crosses the jurisdictional boundary. By amending this term to "fresh pursuit" this law would be consistent with the term used for other law enforcement agencies.

Additionally, SB 2168 provides for a one thousand five hundred feet buffer zone to the jurisdictional limits outlined in the current law. This would allow university law enforcement to be more responsive to emergency situations that may occur near the campus community.

Therefore, I respectfully request the committee consider a "do pass" recommendation on SB 2168. Thank you for your time and consideration. If you have any questions or wish to discuss this further, please feel free to reach out to our office.
