PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1326

Page 1, line 1, after "A BILL" replace the remainder of the bill with "for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 23-02.1-27 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to access to death records.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 23-02.1-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

A certified copy of a complete death record may be issued to a relative, an authorized representative, the child fatality review board, a licensed physician, or a genetic sibling for the purposes of researching family medical history, a funeral director reporting the facts of death, the commissioner of veterans' affairs for a death record of an individual designated as having served in the United States armed forces, or a person with personal or real property interests that depend upon information contained in the complete death record or by the order of a court of competent jurisdiction and may include the cause of death and the social security number. A certified copy of the facts of death record that includes the facts of death and the social security number may be issued to any person that may obtain a certified copy of a complete death record or to any licensed attorney who requires the copy for a bona fide legal determination. A certified copy of an informational death record may be issued to the general public, but the copy may not contain the cause of death or the social security number."

It is needed to obtain records to conduct a thorough review for any patterns or opportunities which may help prevent suicides among ND Veterans. Currently, only the number of North Dakota suicides with military history is available.

I would appreciate the opportunity to present an amendment to House Bill 1326. This amendment simplifies the bill by adding the Commissioner of Veterans Affairs for a death record of an individual designated as having served in the United States armed forces to the list of 8 persons or entities who are currently allowed a certified copy of a complete death record.

Chairman Luick and Senate Agriculture and Veterans Affairs Committee,

I am Michelle Gauvin-Panos, Executive Director of ND Cares and I submit this testimony in support of House Bill 1326, allowing the commissioner of veterans' affairs access to death records of an individual designated as having served in the United States armed forces.

ND Cares is also the organization leading the North Dakota state team in the Governor's Challenge to Reduce Suicide Among Service Members, Veterans, and their Families. The North Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs and the North Dakota Department of Health and Human Services are integral members of that team. We are working directly with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration on priority initiatives in several areas.

One important initiative is to obtain more detailed vital records data for military related deaths, whether they are active duty or veterans, for the purposes of analyzing that data, identifying trends, and deploying multi-agency intervention strategies to reduce further suicides.

Concerning trends could include a number of suicides among service members or veterans of the same era of military service, deployment in the same region, shared experiences, concentrations of suicides in specific areas of the state or among a specific industry.

As an example, last year there were four suicides of energy-industry workers in the northwest part of North Dakota. Much later, it was discovered that they were all veterans. Had this trend been spotted early, potentially life-saving prevention measures could have been administered in the area.

According to the ND Vital Records Department data prepared for ND Cares, there were approximately 141 military related (active duty and veterans) suicides in North Dakota between 2017 and 2022. Working together we can reduce this number in the future – but we require the information to do so.

ND Cares urges the committee to pass HB1390 and allow the North Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs access to records that will ultimately help save lives.
